## On The Way

### *The Mass in Slowest Motion: The Universal Prayer*

In his description of the Mass (c. 155) Saint Justin Martyr states that after the homily “we all rise together and offer prayers for ourselves . . . and for all others, wherever they may be, so that we may be found righteous by our life and actions, and faithful to the commandments, so as to obtain eternal salvation.”

The official name for this is “The Universal Prayer,” sometimes called the “General Intercessions” or “Prayers of the Faithful.” All three terms get at the purpose of these prayers. They are *universal* and *general*, because we pray for the needs of the Church and the entire world, not just our own personal interests or pet concerns. Also, they are *universal* and *general* because the petitions should be broad and concise, not specific and wordy.

They are *intercessions* because by them we plead with God for what the world needs. They are *of the faithful* because those baptized into Christ have a duty to pray for others. Indeed, the entire reason for including these intercessions is because we have a responsibility to the world to intercede. Baptism has made us a “royal priesthood” (1 Pt 2:9). We exercise that baptismal priesthood by offering prayers to God the Father for the salvation of all.

Standing in the place of Christ, the Head of the Body, the priest introduces the Universal Prayers. The deacon, or in his absence, a lector then reads each petition. By responding to the petitions, each member of the congregation signals not just agreement but the lending of his voice to the Church’s plea before the Father.

The intentions that we bring are not random. Since it is as the Body of Christ that we pray, our special interests take second place to the needs of the Church and the world. The Church specifies the categories for our petition. The Universal Prayer should offer prayers for “the Church, for those who govern with authority over us, for those weighed down by various needs, for all humanity, and for the salvation of the whole world.” Particular intentions for a country or local community can be included as well, but never in such a way as to violate the principle of the *universal* prayer.

Some years ago, it was not unusual for the priest to “open up” the general intercessions and invite people in the congregation to voice their own particular intentions.

Recently it was clarified that the intentions should be prepared ahead of time and not opened up in that manner. That practice had led to awkward situations – when, for example, someone would call out a (usually partisan political) intention to counter someone else’s (usually partisan political) intention. Or when people took the opportunity to give a lecture and not just a petition. For those reasons, and also more generally, that practice took away from the dignity of the Mass. It is more fitting that the Body of Christ at prayer be united in one prayer led by the priest.

Finally, on Divine Mercy Sunday we should call to mind the basis on which we appeal to God: our need for His mercy. We do not appeal to Him on our own merits or accomplishments. We appeal to the Father through the merits of His Son and because we, His children, are in need.

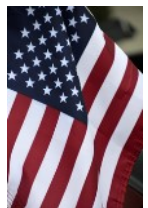

They will attend the wedding rehearsal and be present one hour before and throughout the entire wedding. Wedding Coordinators are prepared to assist with everything concerning the wedding ceremony at the church, except for questions concerning the liturgy. Wedding Coordinators will place decorative bows on pews, receive floral arrangements at the church and place them on the altar, pin boutonnieres and corsages on the wedding party, direct the wedding party when to process down the aisle and assist in maintaining an atmosphere of quiet reverence conducive to prayer. The primary form of communication within the Ministry is email and bimonthly postal mail. The Ministry also meets in person twice a year for fellowship.
