On The Way

The Mass in Slowest Motion: How to receive Communion

The reception of Holy Communion is the summit and consummation of the Mass, the moment at which each of us is united most profoundly with our Lord. True, it is not necessary to receive Communion at Mass. The Church's law obligates us to do so only once a year, during the Easter season (which the current dispensation from the Sunday obligation in turn dispenses). Nevertheless, our Lord comes to us as food because He desires to nourish our souls and increase our union with Him. So, we should seek to receive Him worthily and often.

We should not do so carelessly. From her earliest days the Church has clarified certain conditions and requirements for the reception of Communion.

First, Baptism. To receive the Body of Christ in Holy Communion one must already be in communion with the Body of Christ, the Church. This means that one must be a baptized Catholic. Without Baptism, no other Sacraments can be received. Communion is given to augment the already existing union with Christ and the Church that we have from Baptism.

Second, faith in what the Church teaches. To receive our Lord, one must believe and profess all that the holy Catholic Church believes, teaches, and proclaims to be revealed by God and to be held as true. To say "Amen" to "The Body of Christ" when receiving Communion requires that we also say "Amen" to what the Body of Christ teaches.

Writing around 155AD Saint Justin Martyrs says, "This food is called among us *Eucharistia*, of which no one is allowed to partake but the man who believes that the things which we teach are true, and who has been washed with the washing that is for the remission of sins, and unto regeneration, and who is so living as Christ has enjoined."

This explains the Church's rule against non-Catholics' receiving Communion. That prohibition is not a statement about their personal holiness but simply an acknowledgement that, since we do not have doctrinal communion, we cannot share sacramental Communion.

Third, freedom from mortal sin. Mortal sin severs one's communion with Christ. To receive Him in Communion after having violated communion with Him is a lie. Saint Paul warns the Corinthians, "whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord" and "any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Cor 11:27, 29).

This sheds light on why politicians who advocate positions contrary to Church teaching and the natural law (e.g. abortion) are not to receive Communion. By their political actions, they have broken communion with Christ and His Church. To receive Communion in that state would be deadly for their souls.

Third, fast. We are soul and body. Just as we prepare our souls for Holy Communion by faith and repentance, so we prepare our bodies also. The purpose of the Eucharistic fast is to distinguish heavenly food for the soul from ordinary food for the body. So, the Church requires us to fast from all food and drink for one hour prior to the reception of Holy Communion.

Charitable Giving: Did You Know?

On March 27, the President signed into law the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act to help combat the far-reaching impacts of COVID-19. The bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations, signifying an intent to stimulate philanthropy throughout America. As you look for ways to help those in need, you can consider how the following options may impact your charitable contributions in the 2020 tax year.

Itemizing your charitable +deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional, "above-the-line" deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

Kevin Coleman: A Molder of Men

How can we measure 200-plus outdoor camping experiences, 15-plus "high adventure" trips, 15,760,000 minutes, or 30 years of service, countless other activities like fundraisers and Christmas Tree sales, and the creation of 147 Eagle Scouts? The answer? The legacy of Scoutmaster Kevin Coleman, who is retiring from his duties this summer.

Coleman, a graduate of Saint James Catholic School, Bishop O'Connell High School, and George Mason University, is a life long Saint James parishioner, and a Eucharistic Minister, got involved Scouting in the late-80s, following in his wife Mary's footsteps becoming the

Cubmaster of Cub Scout Pack 681 in 1987. In 1990 he took the position of Assistant Scoutmaster to Saint James' Scout Troop 681, stepping up to Scoutmaster in 1993. Coleman gave Saint James' Scouts a legacy of over thirty years of service, molding young men into outstanding men.

"Kevin has run an extraordinary Scout troop and has had a major, positive, and lasting impact on hundreds of Scouts and scores of Adult Leaders during his tenure," said Joe Knecht, one of Coleman's Eagle Scouts and now District Eagle Advisor for the Boy Scouts of America. "His service will certainly be recognized at the District and Council levels, with great potential for recognition at the National level."

Eagle Scout, Patrick Starr, summed up Coleman's influence and legacy at a ceremony in 2014, saying: "Your dedication is truly an example for all of us to emulate. Without your passion and enthusiasm at the helm, it is doubtful that I would have had the desire to rise through the ranks of Scouting."

Coleman guided 147 members of Troop 681 to the rank of Eagle Scout, Scouting's highest rank. That number included his four sons: Patrick, who passed away in 1999; Michael, Matthew, and Daniel. Coleman's leadership, wisdom, and ability to mold young people, are best exemplified in Troop 681's "Viking" Patrol's transformation in 2008.

"The boys called themselves the Viking Patrol. The scoutmasters called them babies," a January, 2008 Washington Post article explained. Starting out as Scouts who staged sit-down strikes on hikes and continuously bucking the system in every conceivable way, the group, under Coleman's leadership, and mentoring, pulled together, started following the rules, and led and pushed each other to earn the Eagle Scout Award. A feat the Post called "unprecedented."

We wish Kevin Coleman the best as he retires from leading our Scouts here at Saint James. We thank him for his service legacy, devotion to Scouting, and making a significant, personal investment of his time to mold young men into leaders. He has forever cemented his reputation as an outstanding man and a truly exceptional Scoutmaster, who filled all 15,760,00 of his minutes in Saint James' Scouting through every season, with inspiration, leadership, wisdom, and warmth.

Behind the Scenes – St. James Operations Update Summer 2020

By the grace of God and with your help, St. James operations have remained strong during the pandemic. If anything, we have been busier than ever assessing and managing our risks, improving our facilities and our communication technologies, and "balancing the books."

Assessing and Managing our Risks

We have spent many hours working with the Diocese and the appropriate public authorities to promote the safety of our visitors, volunteers, Sisters, priests, and employees. Many decisions had (and still have) to be made, including when and how to: resume public Masses; reopen the Rectory Office to the public; resume ministry activities on campus; and return students to in-person instruction for our School and PREP programs. These decisions have not been easy!

Improving our Facilities and Communication Technologies

Major facility improvement projects this summer included replacing both of our massive School Gym heating/cooling units; replacing the roof over the School's 4th-grade hallway; refinishing all of the exterior doors on our Church; installing pole lighting and painted parking spaces in the driveway next to the Church for parishioners with disabilities; and repairing steam leaks throughout the School.

In the area of communications, we implemented a temporary "Voice Over IP" system to enable our staff to answer the Rectory phone from home; we obtained Zoom accounts to enable us to continue RCIA and staff meetings; and we upgraded our Church and School audio systems for a federally-mandated broadcast frequency change. Most importantly, we built (from scratch) the capacity to live stream Masses, including most recently the installation of a new live stream video camera in our choir loft. Developing our live stream capability has not always been graceful; thank you for your patience!

"Balancing the Books"

We are so grateful to you, our parishioners, for supporting us with your electronic and mailed-in offerings during the crisis. Because of your generosity, along with some prudent cost-cutting on our part, we finished "in the black" for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020. Not only that, but we accomplished this while continuing to pay all St. James staff members their regular wages, even those who were unable to work due to the pandemic. Complete information on our financial results for FY2019-2020 will be sent to you and published in the bulletin this fall.
