On The Way

The Mass in Slowest Motion: The Fraction

After the Sign of Peace, the Mass moves into the *Agnus Dei* – the Lamb of God. We either chant or sing: *Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world*, etc.

The *Agnus Dei* follows the familiar pattern of a threefold petition, in this case to Jesus as the "Lamb of God." The title comes from John the Baptist's declaration about Christ at the Jordan River: *Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!* (Jn 1:29) John is in turn referring to the Passover Lamb, sacrificed to free the Israelites from slavery to the Egyptians. That lamb was just an image of the true Lamb to come. Christ is the true Lamb, sacrificed on Passover to free not only Israel but the entire world from slavery to sin.

But this reference to the Lamb does not point only backward, to Christ's fulfillment of the Passover prefigurement. It also points forward, to heaven, where He is worshipped as the Lamb that was slain (Rev 5:6-14). Those two moments – the Passover sacrifice and the heavenly liturgy – meet in the Mass and specifically in the Eucharist. He is present here and now as the Lamb once slain and eternally worshiped.

From the Lamb we twice ask, *have mercy on us*. Then the third time, we pray, *grant us peace*. Again, like the sign of peace, this peace is not an external reality but an interior one, flowing from our reconciliation with God.

While the *A gnus Dei* is sung or said, the priest breaks off a piece of the consecrated Host and places it in the chalice. While doing so he says, *May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it*. This action signifies the Resurrection of our Lord. Just as the separate consecrations of bread and wine – of His Body and Blood – signified the separation of Body and Blood and therefore sacrifice, so now the mingling of His Body and Blood signify His Resurrection. A reminder that it is the Risen not the dead Christ we receive.

After all these preparations, the priest takes the Host (and Chalice if he wants), holds them before the people, and says, *Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.* This invitation brings together two passages from Scripture. First, the words of John the Baptist mentioned above (Jn 1:29). Second, the invitation to the heavenly liturgy from the Book of Revelation (Rev 19:9). Again, telescoped into this one line are the Passover Lamb, the Last Supper, and the heavenly banquet. Past, present, and future meet here at the altar.

Then the faithful respond, Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed. These words are taken, almost verbatim, from the centurion's response in Matthew 8. By placing these words on our lips, mother Church seeks to cultivate in us both humility and trust as we approach the Eucharistic Lord.




Celebrating A Silver or Golden Wedding Anniversary This Year?
