On The Way

Christmas Figures: Angels, Shepherds, and Magi

You can learn a lot about a man from the company that he keeps. This is as true for our Lord as for anyone else. From the company that surrounds Him in Bethlehem, we can learn a great deal – and not only about Him but also about how we should respond to His birth.

First, the angels – those majestic figures, so awesome and powerful that their first words to us are always, "Do not be afraid." As God entrusted to them a share in His almighty governance of all things, so now at His birth He invites them to participate in His humility. Some angels resent this humility and refuse to participate. They cannot grasp that power would be exercised in such humility or be used for the good of such simple creatures as us. Ironically, their refusal to humble themselves lowers them even below us.

The good angels rejoice at this divine humility. They are not so possessive of their status and power as to resent its humble exercise. They don't mind their share in His governance being at the service of our salvation. So it is that these creatures, so far superior to us by nature, now at Bethlehem worship one of us, the God-Man Jesus Christ.

Second, the shepherds – the simple men from the hills surrounding Bethlehem. We usually depict them as pleasingly rustic. In fact, they were more rugged than rustic. They lived out in the open, among the sheep destined for Temple sacrifice, and without access to life's simplest amenities.

The message of our Lord's birth is announced first to them. Indeed, to the shepherds God bestows a twofold compliment: not only that He takes on our human nature but also that He becomes one of them, a shepherd. Like them, He will be viewed as an outcast, on the margins, all the while tending to what is destined for sacrifice and worship.

Third, the magi. These wise men from the East set out on what must have seemed to be a fool's errand. They followed a star, trusting that their human learning would lead them to something divine. They followed it to a country that resented their discovery. But they ultimately followed it to the source of all wisdom and knowledge, our Lord Himself. By pursuing human knowledge in integrity of heart they came to Incarnate Wisdom.

The last words in the account of the wise men are full of meaning: "they departed for their country by another way" (Mt 2:12). Herod's search for them was one cause of this detour. But those words also convey the fact that, having encountered Christ, the magi could not return home as the same men they were before. Having met the Creator, they would view all of creation differently – with greater reverence, awe, joy, and thanksgiving.

So also we cannot leave the manger unchanged. With the angels we rejoice in God's humility. With the shepherds we rejoice to have God as one of us and as Shepherd for us. With the wise men we realize that all our knowledge and learning – all our human striving – finds its fulfillment in Him, the Word made flesh.

Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail

As you know, since the beginning of the pandemic we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross *farthest* from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross. The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.

Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.


