#### On The Way

The Mass in Slowest Motion: The Collect

After the entrance antiphon and the Sign of the Cross and the greeting and the penitential rite and the *Gloria*... after all that, the priest says something very strange: *Let us pray*. Well, haven't we been praying already? Of course we have. But those were the *Introductory Rites*, which realize their proper purpose in the *Collect*.

The term *Collect* comes from the Latin for "things gathered together." Just so, the *Collect* gathers together into one prayer all the various prayers and intentions of the faithful at Mass. That is why the priest says (or chants), *Let us pray* prior to the prayer. That invitation focuses our attention on the prayer that he is about to say, a prayer that will wrap all of our intentions into one and present them to God. So, when the priest pauses after

saying *Let us pray*, call to mind and unite to his prayer the intentions of your heart.

We can discern three distinct parts in the *Collect*: (1) the Invocation, which addresses God with a description of Who He is and/or what He has accomplished; (2) the Petition, which asks for some grace; (3) the Conclusion, which is always (with few exceptions) the appeal to the Father, through the Son, in the unity of the Holy

Spirit.

The *Collect* also provides a wonderful text for meditation in private prayer. As Saint John Henry Newman says, *in the Collects we put on the full character of a Christian*. Take, for example, the *Collect* from last Sunday, the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. First the invocation: *Grant, we pray, almighty God...* This brief phrase makes a request – *Grant, we pray* – based on a common but underappreciated description: *almighty God.* In short, we pray to God in confidence because He is almighty and capable of answering our prayer. Such confidence in God should characterize all Christian prayer.

Second, the petition proper: *that, always pondering spiritual things, we may carry out in both word and deed that which is pleasing to you.* This is a nice summary of the Christian life. First, the primacy of meditation: *always pondering spiritual things.* In our culture it is so easy to get tugged into superficial, worldly things. Here is a reminder of the need to lift our minds upward, to the sacred. Second, meditation does not remain just meditation. It should so shape our lives that we carry *out in both word and deed that which is pleasing to* Him. Our words and deeds should be pleasing to Him...and that only happens when they flow from our meditation on divine truths.

Then the conclusion: *Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever*. This is so common a phrase that we overlook its significance. In fact, it expresses the fundamental direction and power of our prayer, which is always to the Father, through the Son, Who is one with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit. *Next Week: The Liturgy of the Word*






