On The Way

Catholic Social Doctrine: Christ the King

This Sunday we conclude our novena to Christ the King for the nation. May it bear fruit at this difficult time. Now, the actual feast of Christ the King is not until Sunday, November 22nd. But the original dating of the feast was the end of October and just before the feast of All Saints, which we celebrate this Sunday. So, although the intention was to wrap up just before election day, it is still fitting that we conclude the novena today.

We might make the mistake of thinking of Christ the King as a relic from the ancient world or middle ages, when kings were more common. Of course, devotion to Christ as King is ancient, from the earliest years of the Church. But the *feast* of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1921, just as the monarchies of Europe were unravelling in the wake of World War I.

The Pope's goal was not to revive some antiquated political concept. It was to reassert the rights of God precisely in the modern context, when any acknowledgement or even discussion of him was being banished from the public square. The modern world speaks a lot about human rights. But those rights are incomprehensible and indefensible if the God who bestows them is not acknowledged. In order for human rights to be secure, the rights of God must be honored.

Or perhaps we make the mistake of seeing Christ's kingship as just a personal devotion, something for my private life but not my public. Of course, the devotion is intensely personal. But it is also about the rightful claim that Christ has to our fidelity in our public life. We cannot be Catholic privately and another thing publicly. The world is rightly confused and scandalized when a catholic claims to be "personally opposed" to abortion but publicly supportive of it. Devotion to Christ the King means an unwillingness to compromise one's faith in the public life.

It also places a check on the state, which always tends to expand and claim increasingly more power. Left to itself the state will intrude into every area of our lives, even into our conscience. The accounts of so many martyrs tell this story, of rulers that tried to compel the conscience.

In their fidelity the martyrs also reveal the One who is higher than the state. So, our devotion to Christ the King – not only privately but publicly – places a check on state expansion. It reveals an authority higher than the state's. Indeed, it reveals the One who will one day judge the rulers of the earth.

In a sense, Christ the King is the summary of the Church's social doctrine. He is the ultimate authority, because he is the teacher, the model, and the judge. The teacher, because we ought to shape society according to his words. The model, because in his sacred humanity he fully reveals to us the truth and dignity of the human person. The judge, because he himself will hold accountable all those to whom he entrusted his teaching and example.

Pius XI's motto was Pax Christi in Regno Christi - the Peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ. May we witness to Christ the King in our public life, and thus bring his peace there as well.





Saint James Food Distribution In Need of Donations for November

The Saint James Social Outreach Committee's Food Distribution Program is in critical need of donations to serve the hungry in our parish and the City of Falls Church for the November 6 food distribution. Items most needed are the following "staple" items: canned chicken or tuna, cereal, dry beans (no larger than 3 lbs.), rice (no larger than 3 lbs.), peanut butter, jelly/jam, pasta, pasta sauce, hearty soups, canned fruit. Please no glass jars, bulk, or very large items because these items make it tough on our volunteers. Items can be left in the back of the church. May the Lord bless you for your generosity.
