On The Way

The Christ Side of History

We are now approaching the end of the liturgical year, which always brings to our attention the end of the world. For several weeks now Sunday's Gospel has focused on our Lord's second coming. This culminates next week in the return of the King – of Christ the King, that is. He is the Eternal One, whose return brings an end to history.

Our culture's dominant view of history is the progressive one: that everything is constantly getting better as the years go by. Perhaps it's our scientific advancements that lead to this way of thinking. Penicillin, air conditioning, the internal combustion engine...these things have made life better in many ways. Science is advancing, so everything else must be, right?

So goes the progressive view. It sees the "arc of history" bending to a higher morality, to greater and greater enlightenment, freedom, autonomy, etc. And in certain areas, we *have* seen improvement. Thanks be to God, our nation has done away with slavery and segregation. But at the same time, slavery still exists in the world, sex trafficking plagues our culture, and abortion snuffs out hundreds of thousands of lives annually.

The progressive view of history is that we will find salvation in this inexorable march toward enlightenment and the "right side of history." This is a secular salvation, what the *Catechism* calls "the 'intrinsically perverse' political form of a secular messianism" (CCC 676).

And the so-called "right side of history" can be elusive. Robespierre thought he was on the right side only to end up on the wrong side of the guillotine. Trotsky thought he had it but found himself on the wrong side of Stalin.

The Catholic view of history is markedly different. Salvation does not come from this world nor will it be experienced fully in this world. We will not "realize within history that messianic hope which can only be realized beyond history through the eschatological judgement" (CCC 676).

Contrary to the progressive view of ever-improving humanity, our human weakness remains. No matter how science might advance, it is still fallen man who wields it. Our persistent human weakness often leads us to use science not for good but for brutal and barbaric things.

When our Lord speaks of the end times (Mt 24; Mk 13; Lk 21), he describes not a progressive enlightenment but a growing darkness and increasing persecution. The book of Revelation likewise describes mounting immorality and brutality as history unfolds.

Now, none of this should cause discouragement. On the contrary, only those who trust in history itself will be disappointed. Those who trust in the Lord of History will be consoled and strengthened.

Nor does this mean that we don't strive for justice in this world. Indeed, we have a *duty* to spread his kingdom. Yet, even as we strive to see that his will is done on earth as it is in heaven, we know that the Kingdom "will be fulfilled not by a historic triumph of the Church through a progressive ascendancy, but only by God's victory over the final unleashing of evil" (CCC 677).


November 15 is World Day of the Poor
