

On The Way

The Final Judgment

Today's celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King is the last Sunday of the liturgical year. Next Sunday we enter into Advent and begin the annual meditation on the mysteries our Lord's life: his birth, baptism, preaching, transfiguration, passion, resurrection, and ascension.

With the end of the liturgical year also comes a consideration of the end of all things and the second coming of Christ. He came once in humility, as Savior. He will come again in glory, as Judge. Today's feast and Gospel both emphasize the power he has as King and Judge of all. They touch on what we profess every week in the Creed: *He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead*. And since we "know neither the day nor the hour" (Mt 25:13) we must be vigilant for his return.

But what is the purpose of this final judgment of the King?

It is, first of all, a vindication. Justice is never complete in this world. This side of heaven, things will never be made whole. Something is always lacking. Indeed, our deep desire for justice and the knowledge that we cannot find it fully here on earth already hint at a final judgement when all will be set right.

Christ's coming in glory will vindicate all who have waited in hope for him, all who have been denied justice in this world, all who have suffered for their faith in him. At the same time, justice will be done to those who have rejected, denied, or neglected him.

This is all very personal. Human judges have to proceed according to external evidence and human laws. From that they discern the reality: guilt or innocence. Christ is different. He is both the Judge and the standard of judgment. He judges how we stand in relation to him, how we have come to be like him. His very coming reveals the secrets of every heart. "Then will the conduct of each one and the secrets of hearts be brought to light. Then will the culpable unbelief that counted the offer of God's grace as nothing be condemned" (CCC 678).

Who we have determined ourselves to be over the course of our lives will be revealed in an instant. How much we have accepted his grace and allowed it to form us in his likeness will be starkly seen as we stand in comparison to him. "In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each man's relationship with God will be laid bare" (CCC 1039).

The final judgment is also a manifestation of our Lord's mercy. In the revelation of all his works, we will see the full extent of how his mercy has worked throughout the centuries. "We shall know the ultimate meaning of the whole work of creation and of the entire economy of salvation and understand the marvelous ways by which his Providence led everything towards its final end. The Last Judgment will reveal that God's justice triumphs over all the injustices committed by his creatures and that God's love is stronger than death" (CCC 1040).

May his coming in glory be for us a cause of hope – not only to see his truth vindicated but even more to see him victorious.



St. James' Garden Grows

If you've been by the St. James House of Ministries lately, at 913 Park Avenue, you might have noticed a new addition to the field behind the house, a vegetable garden. The garden, planted back in April, was the idea of parishioner Zoey Maraist. "It had been on my heart for a long time to form a care ministry at St. James, and, after a few talks with Father Oetjen to discuss what form that ministry might take, we decided to plant a garden." "Growing food that we could then donate to those in need spoke strongly to me."

Over 17 parishioners helped with the garden throughout the spring and summer months, watering, weeding, and harvesting the produce. "Weeding is an overwhelming task, and we had lots of weeds. It's entirely possible that, in the end, the weeds won," Zoey said wryly. It is a bit doubtful that the weeds won, given the bounteous produce that the garden plot produced—beans, peppers of every variety, some squash, and tomatoes. Through their hard work and loving care of the garden, the volunteers donated food to every St. James First Friday Food Distribution from July through October.

"It has been gratifying for me to be involved in this project," said Zoey, "to take a plot of land and turn it into food for those who are in need has been a great experience." Zoey went on to say that "gardening helps you quickly understand what you don't know, and you end up spending a lot of time filling in those knowledge gaps with your efforts, and the help of others." She stressed, "you don't have to be an expert to garden, but it is quite helpful to have those who are around you." Two parishioners that have been extremely helpful with the effort "have been Joe Knecht and Karen Bushaw-Newton."

2021 will see an expanded garden, "about double the size," according to Zoey. Among the plans are raised beds for the garden, allowing more food to be grown. A young man is building the beds as part of his Boy Scout project. They should be "ready by "March or April if all goes well." As for what's on the planning, er, planting books for next year - "cabbage, cucumbers, more varieties of squash, and, perhaps, strawberries." "We also plan to grow more flowers next season, as they are used to decorate both the Shrine of the Blessed Virgin Mother on the Park Avenue side of the Church."

If you want to get involved with the garden project, it's never too late! While everything got off to a good start this year, the gardeners need your help to keep the food growing. "Parishioners, and other interested folks, can help through joining in the labor or by donating seeds, soil, and plants. "Help with weeding and watering is especially needed throughout the growing season," noted Zoey. "The garden is an especially good project for students who need to perform service hours."

"I especially want to thank Father Oejten and Father Scalia for their encouragement and support throughout this project," said Zoey while finishing up our interview. "They allowed us to take our vision and make it a reality, and for that, we are grateful."
