### On The Way

Figures of Advent: Zechariah

The best way to prepare for our Lord's birth is to draw close to those who prepared for his first coming, to those figures who occupy the infancy narratives in the Gospels. Their reception of and response to the news of Christ's birth help us understand how we should respond – and how we shouldn't.

The first such figure is Zechariah, the husband of Elizabeth and the father of John the Baptist. Indeed, his is the first name mentioned in Saint Luke's narrative (Lk 1:5-25). Unfortunately, what he provides is mainly a *negative* example.

We first encounter Zechariah when he is fulfilling his priestly duty in the Temple in Jerusalem. He has gone into the sanctuary to offer incense for the people when the angel Gabriel appears and announces the birth of a son to him and Elizabeth.

Of course, this is great news, the answer to their prayers. The angel makes this explicit: "your prayer has been heard." But it's too good to be true and Zechariah refuses to believe. "How am I to know this?" he retorts. That phrase has the sense of "Oh, yeah? Prove it." In a bitter irony, Zechariah, whose name means "The Lord has remembered," has not remembered the Lord and his promises.

"How am I to know this?" Of course, the angel – the messenger of God – standing right before him should be proof enough. As a devout Jew, Zechariah also knew the story of Abraham and Sarah (Gen 18), of how God gave them the child of the promise in their old age. That also should have provided context and a motive for belief. Still, the news is too incredible for him: he fails to believe.

In response, the archangel removes his faculty of speech: "you will be speechless and unable to talk until the day these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be fulfilled at their proper time." The punishment is apt: if we do not have faith in God, then we really have nothing to say.

Zechariah's story is a cautionary tale. He is a figure of doubt, of giving up on God and refusing to wait for the Lord. To a degree he resembles Abraham, who also tired of the Lord's seeming delay and, taking things into his own hands, created even greater troubles for himself.

Nevertheless, Zechariahs' negative example helps us insofar as it emphasizes the importance of waiting on the Lord. We live in a culture incapable of waiting. Our way of life is rushed, and our technology accustoms us to immediate results. Not so many years ago we had to wait for a letter to arrive, for food to be prepared, and so on. Now we expect such things instantaneously.

It is the devil who promises immediate results. He never delivers, of course. But he knows our discomfort with waiting and our desire for control. From the first he made the false promise of immediate control: "When you eat of it... you will be like God..."

God makes us wait. It seems cruel, but it is a great kindness. Faith grows by waiting. We know this in our own relationships: if we trust – have faith in – a person, then we're willing to wait. So also with God: our waiting for him reveals our trust in him. And the more we wait on God, the stronger our faith becomes.



### Behind the Scenes – St. James Operations Update, Fall 2020

We praise God here at St. James for his many blessings, including our ability to:

- Celebrate Mass in-person (with social-distance restrictions) and online;
- Provide School students (carefully!) with in-person teaching, learning, and socializing; and
- Open our Rectory Office to you during business hours (yes, we're smiling beneath our masks).

Thank you for continuing your support of St. James during this difficult time. St. James ended the first quarter of our fiscal year on September 30. Despite the decrease in Mass attendance necessitated by social distancing, our Offertory Income was down by only -\$29,000 (or -6%) for the quarter. Support for the new School year has been inspiring. The School exceeded its student enrollment targets, enrolling 467 students this year, including 44 in our first-ever preschool classes.

Even with these positives, St. James total income was down by -\$141,000, and total expenses were over-budget by +\$33,000 for the quarter. The problem is...the pandemic, which has curtailed the services that we can provide and required that we buy such things as masks, face shields, desk shields, fans, HEPA air purifiers, and MERV-13 filters for our heating and air-conditioning systems. If we run a deficit for the fiscal year, we have emergency reserves as well as the possibility of receiving loan forgiveness through the federal CARES Act to cover it. We strive to be faithful and prudent stewards of the resources that have been entrusted to us. At bottom, however, we owe the financial strength of St. James to you.

Most of the big facilities projects we undertake, such as the replacement of roofs and heating/ cooling units, are not glamorous. A refreshing exception is the project of repairing and refinishing all of the church's exterior doors. I hope that you enjoy looking at our beautiful and historic church more than ever now that the door work is complete.



### For a Life of Prayer
