## On The Way

Indulgences

If most people know anything about indulgences, it is about their abuse: some priests and even prelates sold indulgences in the middle ages and early Renaissance. Of course, the abuse of something does not eliminate its use. The Church never approved of the abuses. The Council of Trent decreed that "all evil gains for the obtaining of indulgences be wholly abolished." Indeed, people might be surprised to learn that the Church still grants indulgences. Nor is this some dark secret; there's an entire section in the Catechism on it (CCC 4171-1479).

The reality of indulgences rests on two truths. First, that sin has a double consequence: guilt and disorder. Sin not only makes us guilty before almighty God, it also introduces a certain disorder into our souls. It twists us out of shape and turns us away from God. Now, the prayer of absolution in Confession frees us from guilt. But the disorder from sin remains. We still need to be purified banged back into shape - by way of penances and sacrifices. This is what the Church calls the "temporal punishment due to sin." Thus, the priest assigns a penance in the confessional, so that by making some sacrifice your soul will be healed of sin's disorder. Then the sufferings and trials we encounter in life become occasions (if we let them) of further purification. Finally, purgatory is the "place" where God, in both mercy and justice, purifies us from any remaining effects of sin.

Indulgences also rest on the truth that the Church is the dispenser of the merits of Christ and his saints. She possesses what is called the "treasury of merit," from which she confers on individuals particular graces. In a sense, we draw from this treasury every time we go to Confession. There the Church opens the wealth of grace and merit and through her ministry frees us from sin.

An indulgence is the partial or total remission of the temporal punishment due to sin extended to us by the Church. We can obtain an indulgence either for ourselves or for a deceased person. The Church attaches the granting of indulgences to some charitable work or act of devotion (e.g. praying the rosary with others, reading scripture for 15 minutes, etc.) When we do such things, the Church opens the treasury of merits to us or to the deceased for whom we pray. Of course, it's not automatic. That line of thinking would lead us back to purchasing indulgences. No, an indulgence is obtained as an act of devotion. Thus it requires not only the act itself, but complete detachment from sin, Sacramental Confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the Holy Father's intentions (one *Our Father*, *Hail Mary, Glory Be*).

During the month of November, when we give special attention to praying for the dead, we should also strive to obtain indulgences for them. This year, because of the Covid restrictions, the Vatican has new norms. Thus, the plenary indulgence normally obtained by visiting a cemetery between November 1 and November 8 can be obtained on any day in November 2020 and even by those who visit a cemetery "even if only mentally."

Please remember the dead in your prayers and seek to obtain indulgences for them, to hasten their journey to glory.


