#### On The Way

Catholic Social Doctrine: Media and Communication

On December 4, 1963 Pope Saint Paul VI promulgated the Church's Decree on the Media of Social Communications. At that time the document must have seemed prescient. At this point, with the rapid advance in technology in the intervening years, some might think it quaint. Honestly, I've never really paid much attention to this document, or to its corresponding paragraphs in the Catechism (CCC 2493-2499). I suspect it's not prominent on your radar screen either.

But recent events have made that document, and the Church's words on communication in general, more important. In the past several years (not to mention the past several weeks) greater scrutiny has been given to the social media giants, their power to censor, and their ability to use our personal information to move public opinion. Further, as we all know, social media is often used in a wildly inordinate and irresponsible (to put it lightly) manner. These realities highlight the importance of communication in building a just society and the consequent responsibility of both its producers and users.

Two principles of the Church's social teaching guide us in this consideration. First, the truth of the human person; specifically, that we are created to know and share the truth. We therefore have both the obligation to seek it and the corresponding right to obtain it. We also have the obligation to be truthful in our communications.

Second, the principle of solidarity – that awareness of our common human nature and shared responsibility to one another. "Solidarity is a consequence of genuine and right communication and the free circulation of ideas that further knowledge and respect for others" (CCC 2495).

Truth and solidarity: these are essential to a just society. And the way we use the means of communications will either help or hurt them.

"Society has a right to information based on truth, freedom, justice, and solidarity: The proper exercise of this right demands that the content of the communication be true and – within the limits set by justice and charity – complete. Further, it should be communicated honestly and properly. This means that in the gathering and in the publication of news, the moral law and the legitimate rights and dignity of man should be upheld" (CCC 2494).

"It is necessary that all members of society meet the demands of justice and charity in this domain. They should help, through the means of social communication, in the formation and diffusion of sound public opinion" (CCC 2495).

These words should guide those who run the big media outlets and social media platforms. They should also guide any governmental regulations. But what the Church could not foresee in the 1963 document or the 1994 Catechism is that by 2020 the means of communication would not be limited to "the media." Today everyone with a smart phone is a participant, perhaps even an "influencer."

Thus, we have to apply this guidance of the Church to our own use of social media - so that we use the media at our disposal for promoting the truth, not mere rumor or opinion; for increasing solidarity, not division.



# Saint James Parish

Dear briends in Christ,

AM PLEASED TO PRESENT THE ANNUAL REPORT FOR SAINT JAMES
Parish. This consists of the financial report for FY 2020 as well as a review of our pastoral work.
Flease take some time to review how God has blessed us this past year.

As you can see, we ended FY 2020 very well. We budgeted for a net surplus of \$88K, and ended with an astonishing surplus of \$374K. So...,what's to account for this performance in such a difficult time? Well, two very simple things; generosity and stewardship. Your continued support during the pandemic, especially through Faith Direct and by mailing in contributions, was a great blessing. We saw such an increase in offertony giving that even with the downturn we still ended 1% over our offertory budget. I pray that God rewards your generosity. The other deciding factor was our ability to reduce expenses: 8% under budget for the year.

In light of these blessings, I sought the Finance Council's guidance on tithing our surplus to a poorer parish. The Council was unanimous in encouraging this. So, as a way of thanking God for His goodness to Saint James, we will donate S50K to Saint Anthony of Padua Parish. As you might know, Saint Anthony is in a poorer section of Talls Church. Its large Hispanic community has suffered the effects of COVID-19 disproportionately. The sharing of our blessings will assist in their proclamation of the Gospel and service to the poor.

The spreadsheet does not capture all dimensions of parish life. We had many good events and initiatives through February: our parish picnic, the Immaculate Conception Novena, our First Friday Food Distribution, the Lenten Days of Recollection, Lenten Friday Fish Fry. and so on. All was wunderful...and then COVID.

Thanks be to God, the resourcefulness and hostle of staff and parishioners during the shutdown enabled us to continue many good things and begin new ones. Our lish bry became an even more popular drive through. The ingenuity of that spilled over and enabled our Food Distribution to continue — and increase! Saint James School had online classes up and running within days. Our religious education program continued and concluded with First Communion and Confirmation ceremonies over the summer. We livestreamed our entire Mass schedule and increased times for Confession and Eucharistic Adoration.

We are now several months into FY 2021. Our school is fully open, religious ed is working on a hybrid model, we have extra Masses, Confessions, and Adoration. Still, the downturn in Mass attendance means our offertory numbers are down. COVID restrictions continue to affect our volunteer opportunities and our ability to gather as a parish. But with your prayers and help we will continue to find new and creative ways to serve one another and the broader community.

I will speak on these matters at all Masses for Sunday, October 25th. At that time, I will also invite you to make an offertory commitment for the coming year. Yes, we do depend on your generosity even

more (the first several months of FY 2021 have already not been good for revenue). But your decision of what to commit should be inwardly decided, as the Apostle tells us (cf. 2 Cor 9:7). So, I ask you to please reflect and pray on your offertory commitment for the coming year. It should be a deliberate expression of your gratitude to God for His gifts and your desire to give back.

Through the intercession of Our Lady and Saint James, may the Lord bless and keep you.

ISCAL YEAR 2020 ended with some amazing results. The generosity of our parishioners, who continued to give even during the suspension of public masses, helped us to not only make our offertory budget but to exceed it by \$15,000. The indomitable "can do" spirit of our volunteers ensured that our Fish Fry and Food Distribution remained in place, done safely as drive through operations. Our Social Outreach volunteers came up with new initiatives such as "Pop-N-Go" for food collection and "Pop-N-Go for Wee Ones" to help expectant mothers via donations to Project Gabriel and A Woman's Choice. Our School's PTO did not let the cancellation of the Emerald Gala get them down but rather, put together three virtual auctions that were highly successful and raised money for the purchase of new active boards for the school. The Knights of Columbus served the needs of our elderly and homebound parishioners, by checking in and bringing groceries. Thanks to the generosity of our volunteers and their love of the sacraments, we now have regular confession and Eucharistic adoration hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

GOING FORWARD, we ask that you stay engaged with the parish and a sacramental life in whatever capacity you can. We also ask you to continue to pray for the end of the pandemic, for the needs of the poor and for the entire St. James Parish and School Community.

- Livestream platform built from scratch in three business days;

- 14,624 total live viewers for all Sunday & daily Masses;
- \$93,000+ raised for the school, including our Annual Appeal and Guardian Angel Scholarship Funds; and
- \$108,000+ raised by PTO via three virtual Galas, including \$20,000+ for this year's Fund-A-Cause for new Smart Boards.





## **Roll your Clocks Back on November 1**

Don't forget that Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 1, at 2:00am, with clocks rolling back one hour to return to standard time. If you don't, you will arrive at Mass an hour early on Sunday—which is always a good thing, but might be inconvenient for you and your family if you didn't plan to.

Daylight Savings Time, as we know it, began in 1974—but it has been practiced in various forms in the US since 1918. It will resume on March 14, 2021, at which point we will roll our clocks forward one hour.


