

#### On The Way

Post Lenten Thank You!

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Although it's a fitting day for many different reflections (seeing that mercy is central to our faith), I'd like to take this space to express my thanks to the many volunteers who make such an enormous difference at Saint James. Now, I can't possibly list every group, but all the work during Lent and Holy Week deserves recognition.

Now, some people don't want to be mentioned, so I'm not going to name names. But...the volunteers deserve some recognition, if only by group. And since it doesn't look like we'll be able to have our volunteer appreciation dinner (again) this seems a fitting time do so.

First, thank you to the Lenten fish fry crew! The fish fry provides great food and raises money for our social outreach. It also provides an opportunity for different parishioners to come together, get to know each other, and to be of service. Building on last year's success, the fish fry was entirely drive-thru this year. And as anyone driving down Broad Street or Park Avenue on a Friday in Lent knows...it was a hit. Popping by to visit the volunteers (and pick up some fish) is fun, but also a little intimidating. The hustle and bustle of that well-oiled machine is a marvel to watch, and I was always concerned about messing up the process somehow. My only complaint is that the fish fry is so much fun...and delicious...that it doesn't seem quite penitential enough for Lent!

The Social Outreach Committee. This group does great work on behalf of the poor in our area. This past March, the monthly Food Distribution fell on the same night as the second fish fry. It was great to see both groups collaborating, building community, and serving others. I'm so grateful that the SOC reminds us of the needs of the poor and provides opportunities to help them.

Our ushers. We priests rely on the ushers far more than most people realize. With our increased Mass schedule and the needed wiping down of the pews, the ushers have had more on their plate than before. They've handled it wonderfully. Thank you especially to all those who stepped up since Masses returned last May.

Our lectors. As for the ushers, the extra Sunday Mass and all the different liturgies for Holy Week have meant more work for our lectors. They've shown themselves more than capable! Again, I'm grateful to those who answered the request for more volunteers last Spring. We've added a good number of new lectors.

Our sacristans. Okay, here I'm lumping together a number of different groups. Point is, as with any production, Catholic liturgy depends on a lot of behind-thescenes preparations. The flowers, linens, altar cloths, candles, sacred vessels, etc. These all lend a beauty and dignity to the Mass that we don't notice...until it's gone. The attention and care given to such details and by so many volunteers is a true blessing. It goes a long way in making our liturgies so beautiful.

Yes, I'm sure I've missed someone. That's the danger of giving public thanks. But neither can I let that prevent me from expressing my gratitude. If you're interested in volunteering, please click "Communities and Ministries" on our parish website.

#### **Church During COVID-19**

In keeping with the Governor's executive orders, please observe social distancing and wear a mask when in the church.

#### **Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail**

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass

it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross farthest from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross.
- The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.
