

#### On The Way

Catechesis on Creation: Introduction

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* makes this very simple observation: "Catechesis on creation is of major importance" (CCC 282). Now, this is an enormous understatement. Such catechesis has always been of major importance. We need to know where we come from and why we were created. Our origin sheds light on our end. (Perhaps this accounts for the great interest in genealogy: in knowing where we come from we hope to understand ourselves better.)

Questions about our origin have been at the heart of much intellectual debate over the past several centuries. Every major philosopher tries to give an account of where we come from in order to explain his particular theory of how we ought to live. Thomas Hobbes famously described our state of nature as "solitary, poor, nasty, brutish, and short" – such that the government must arise to keep us in place. On the other extreme, Jean-Jacques Rousseau told us that we were "born free" but on account of society we are "everywhere in chains." Really, the only thing these men got right was the intuition that our beginnings tell us about who we are, why we are, and how we ought to live.

Although always necessary, catechesis on creation takes on a greater importance today than ever before. Pope Emeritus Benedict described our era as "the age of sin against God the Creator." That is a sobering line from a man who chooses his words carefully. Every age has its own particular vice and rebellion. Ours is against the most fundamental truth of our relationship to God, as creatures to their Creator. Perhaps never before have we been so alienated from creation, from our own created nature, and therefore from the Creator.

With this in mind, I will dedicate this space over the next several months (with periodic interruptions, no doubt) to a catechesis on creation. My reflections will draw principally from the first three chapters of Genesis and the corresponding paragraphs from the *Catechism* (CCC 279-421).

A few words about words. When describing the world and our place in it, I think it's better to use the word "creation" rather than "nature." The word "creation" immediately indicates that there is a Creator, an Author of all things – which in turn indicates a certain intentionality and design. No one creates without having a purpose or end for his creation. Such intentionality and design in turn indicate our need to observe and, yes, obey the purpose of creation. The word "nature" lacks those important implications.

For our purposes, the word "nature" means something different than just the great outdoors. It indicates what a thing is. God created each thing with a particular "nature" – meaning the characteristics that make it what it is: a rock, a tree, an elephant, a man, or an angel. Thus, we speak of mineral, vegetable, animal, human, and angelic natures.

Our human nature – what makes us human – is the source of what we have come to call our "natural rights." Such rights arise from our created nature, from what God has created us to be. This illustrates how a catechesis on creation and the proper understanding of human nature is not vain but influences things here and now, even our politics.
