

On The Way

Catechesis on Creation: Ex nihilo

The Bible begins with one of the most important and revolutionary sentences in history: "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth" (Gen 1:1). This verse is so familiar to us that we might miss the extraordinary truth it contains. There were plenty of other accounts of creation in the ancient world. They presented the world as coming about through the conflict of cosmic forces or some other drama. Genesis's first verse presents a stark difference: "In the beginning – that is, before there was anything – God – and no one else – created – brought out of nothing – the heavens and the earth." This sober, brief line contains many truths about the Creator and His creation.

First, God alone creates. To "create" (as we use it in the Apostles Creed) means to bring something out of nothing — *ex nihilo*, as the traditional doctrine describes it. To "make" something means to take prior material and form something new; for example, to take wood and make a chair. We do that all the time (and so does God). But God alone creates. Which means that all that exists, everything that *is*, comes from God's creative will. He alone is the Creator.

Second, God creates alone. Unlike ancient myths of creation, the Genesis account does not present God as just one being among many, dependent on other factors, or compelled to create. Nor is His creation the inevitable emanation from His being as Platonists saw it. Creation is the deliberate and free act of God. "And God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light" (Gen 1:3). He is perfectly free in the act of creation.

Third, it is the good God Who creates. Ancient myths presented certain elements of creation – typically the physical world and the human body – as evil because coming from evil forces. The understanding in Genesis is that because God is good His creation is good. Fire cannot be the cause of cold and the good God cannot be the cause of evil. Thus, we hear repeatedly through the first chapter of Genesis that "it was good."

Finally, God is transcendent from His creation. The Creator is distinct and transcendent from the world He created. This insistence on God's transcendence guards against pantheism, the idea that God is part of creation or even that creation *is* God. He is not part of the world or present in the world as part of creation.

The proper understanding of God's transcendence also guards us from the error of deism, which interprets that transcendence as apartness. The famous image is that of the clockmaker who winds up his creation (in fact, not a creation but a product!) and walks away from it. That does not describe the God of Genesis. On the contrary, precisely because God is transcendent from His creation and not confined to any one part of it, He is present to His creation at all times and in all places.

All of this is why in the history of Judaism and Christianity more than in any other faith, we find creation to be a place where we learn about God. We find Him in both "The Book of Nature and the Book of Scripture." It is this confidence in God's authority, freedom, goodness, and presence that enables us to rejoice in His creation.



In keeping with the Governor's executive orders, please observe social distancing and wear a mask when in the church.

Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross farthest from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross.
- The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.




