



On The Way

Technology and the Tree: Contraception

Our digital technology isn't the only technology to change society. Over the past 60 years, contraception has radically changed how we think about ourselves and our relationships, and how we structure society. Here I don't intend to go into all the reasons for the Church's teaching against contraception. I simply mean to consider the danger of conforming ourselves to technology rather than the reverse.

Contraception confirms Plato's assertion that the inventor of a thing is the worst judge of his invention's effects. Contraception's great promise was better and stronger marriages. It promised couples the ability to come together in the marital embrace without the stress of another child. That hasn't come about as predicted. Marriage is manifestly not healthier or happier today than 60 years ago. In fact, today fewer choose to marry than at any other time in our history. (Also, not everyone had promised good from contraception. Margaret Sanger, the eugenicist and foundress of Planned Parenthood, hoped that it would be helpful in "weeding out the unfit.")

The history of contraception also shows how quickly we alter our morals to fit our technology. Until the 20th century, all Christians believed the same thing about contraception. In 1930, the Anglican Communion's Lambeth Conference gave what seemed to be modest permission for its use. In response, The Washington Post stated that if the new Anglican teaching were carried into effect, it "would sound the death-knell of marriage as a holy institution, by establishing degrading practices which would encourage indiscriminate immorality."

More to the point, what prompted the Anglicans' new teaching wasn't a theological development but a technological change. Contraceptive techniques had simply become more effective; the teaching changed to accommodate the easier use. The tail wagged the dog. This shifting of morals to fit technology would be more pronounced with the advent of effective hormonal contraceptives in the 1960's.

Finally, contraception shows how an invention, while ostensibly resolving one difficulty, creates others. In this regard, we must take seriously the connection between contraception and abortion. The conventional wisdom is that contraception is a way of preventing abortions. After all, if there's no conception, there's no need for abortion. But that's not the case.

First, hormonal contraceptives are themselves abortifacients; when they prevent attachment of the embryo to the uterine wall, they cause a chemical abortion. Further, contraception creates the conditions for abortion. By using it, a couple chooses against the arrival of a child. If a child should come, abortion poses a tempting solution to an already-unwanted child. John Paul II spoke of this connection. Perhaps more compelling because a secular source, the Supreme Court of the United States made the same observation in Planned Parenthood v. Casey. In upholding Roe V. Wade, it explained that people had come to rely "on the availability of abortion in the event that contraception should fail." We again encounter the ambiguity of technology. In grasping for it to resolve one problem, we create others.

The meaning of our bodies is fully understood only in the chaste union of a man and a woman that is open to life. By accepting contraception decades ago, we removed from our consciousness the most obvious reason for the distinction between the sexes: procreation. Now we struggle even to define man and woman. It's another sad reminder that the human person should determine the use of technology, not be determined by it.



Behind the Scenes – St. James Operations Update Fall 2021


Thanks to your support, St. James continues to be financially strong. On September 30th, we completed our first quarter of the new fiscal year. Offertory Income totaled \$503,380, which was 9% over our budget. Total Income was \$954,541 – almost exactly on budget. Total Expenses (\$1,702,396) were over budget by 4%, due mainly to some much needed facilities items, including:

- Replacing a coil in one of the heating/cooling units in the Church;
- Replacement of some leaking heating system pipes beneath Heller Hall:
- Repairing the Gym roof to resolve a leak problem that had damaged the Gym floor:
- Repainting the Parish House, including the replacement of some rotted wood:
- Repainting selected School Entrances; and
- Purchasing tables for students to eat lunch, socially distanced, in Heller Hall.




Saint James Catholic School Annual Appeal




