



### On The Way

Technology and the Tree: The Cult of Unreality

Creator of the Stars of Night, an ancient Advent hymn, speaks of the "sorrow that the ancient curse should doom to death a universe." Because of original sin (the ancient curse) the world is wounded. We know that there is much good in the world. But we also know that there is no escape from suffering, trials, and sorrow. Still, we try to escape.

In the physical realm, human existence is often a matter of fight or flight. The same applies to the spiritual. We often have a choice of fight or flight, engage or escape. Either we engage in and fight through difficulties, challenges, and sufferings – or we escape and flee them. It is the choice between engaging a difficult reality or escaping to a seemingly pleasant unreality. Flight from reality has always been the temptation for fallen humanity.

All sin has an element of flight and escapism. A man might drink to numb himself to the difficulties of life. Another might commit adultery to flee the demands of marriage and family. Another lies to avoid trouble or discomfort. And so on, even to the first sin. By their rebellion, Adam and Eve sought to escape their creatureliness and dependence on God.

Left unchecked and unrepented, this tendency within us becomes a fixed attitude of preferring our own manufactured – "virtual" – reality to reality itself. The great spiritual writer, Edward Leen (one of Mother Teresa's favorites) warned of the modern world's "cult of unreality." And that was in the 1930's!

For years, science fiction sounded warnings against unreality. Books and movies conveyed the idea that it is better to live an authentic but difficult human life than to live in unreality. Mary Shelley's Frankenstein is a cautionary tale about constructing our own reality. Aldous Huxley's Brave New World presents the tragic death of a man striving for authenticity amid a manufactured, drugged, artificial society. The movies Gattica and Surrogates (not a very good film) send the message that reality needs to rebel against unreality.

Escapism has always beset us. Our technology enables us to indulge it more quickly, easily, and deeply. We feel it in simple ways. Working on a project gets difficult, so you toggle over to your favorite news site or social media app...and before you realize it, time has flown by. Or, because dealing with people face to face is challenging, we escape into digital communication. Now comes the "metaverse," which, according to one description, "is an immersive internet experience that lets you replace or augment reality with computerized simulations." Here's a good rule of thumb: Beware of anyone who promises to "replace" or "augment" reality.

One of the pains of Covid and (more specifically) the lockdowns was the lack of human contact. To one degree or another, all of us were cut off from real human contact. Some people couldn't even be with their loved ones as they died. We were reduced to the virtual. If we discovered anything from that, you would think that it our profound need for human contact without a screen's mediating it.

In the end, none of this makes our devices evil. They're inanimate objects. But it teaches us two lessons: first, not to be used by them; second, to use them in a way that doesn't indulge our tendency to escape.



Dear Friends in Christ.


N THE PAST FEW MONTHS, Bishop Burbidge began two big projects that have bearing on Saint James School. On Sunday, November 21st, the feast of Christ the King, he opened the first year of preparation for the Diocese of Arlington's Golden Jubilee. The theme of this year is Remember. We look back and remember the many blessings God has bestowed on the Church in Northern Virginia over the past 50 years. Of course, since Saint James has been around longer than the Diocese itself, we have even more to remember and celebrate!

Now, at the heart of education is the mission to remember, to hand on to future generations the knowledge, writings, art, history, and wisdom of the past. At the heart of Catholic education is to accomplish all of that, as well as to remember – to hand down – the truths of the Catholic faith. We strive to give our students the knowledge of their story as children of God. By remembering God's words and actions, and by making them present in the Sacraments, we give the students a knowledge of eternal value, that they are children of God.

During this year of Remember, the Bishop has asked us to focus on revitalizing faith in the Eucharist. As we hear at every Mass, Jesus commanded His Apostles at the Last Supper, Do this in memory of me. Of course, the Eucharist is more than a memory; it is the making present of Christ's sacrifice of love for us. And the children of Saint James encounter that as they attend Mass every week with their class, and once a month with the whole school. By their participation in the Mass, they remember and learn God's love, made present in the Eucharist.

Second, in September Bishop Burbidge announced the new Diocesan strategic plan. This five-year plan has as one of its goals making Catholic schools more affordable and accessible. For us at Saint James to achieve that goal requires

our renewed energy and creativity, and your continued support. By way of your generosity, we have been able to make the





### OUR SCHOOL AT A GLANCE

- In 1923, under the leadership of Mother Josepha Clarke, the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (IHM) took over the teaching and administration of the school with 92 students.
- In 1953, Saint James School was the largest Catholic school in Virginia, with 2,000 students!
- Enrollment peaked in 1956-57 with 2,297 students. K-2 studied in split shifts; some classes had 60 students.
- Today, there are 496 students, including 57 in our new preschool (plus a waitlist!).
- Under the IHM's leadership, our school's reputation for academic excellence, service and spiritual formation continues to thrive.



# The ARLENE C. TATE Memorial Scholarship That a St. Tames parishioner had

N MAY OF 2021, we announced that a St. James parishioner had established the first endowed scholarship for our parish school. His name is Mr. Thomas N. Tate and he created a \$50,000 scholarship in memory of his beloved wife Arlene C. Tate, who died in March of 2013 after a difficult and heroic battle with esophageal cancer.

Arlene was born on September 4, 1925 in Salt Lake City, Utah. She was the only child of Peter and Fanny Christensen of Ogden, Utah. Following the death of her father in 1934, Arlene and her mother returned to Ogden, where she later attended Weber State University. After college, she embarked on an exciting 30-year career with NASA (see sidebar).

Following her NASA career, Arlene joined Comsat where she was Director of Procurement for Earth Stations for 10 years. She then became an aerospace industry consultant until health challenges caused her to stop working in 1995.

Arlene was an elegant dresser who enjoyed playing bridge with her friends and serving as President of various civic clubs including the Women's Club of Falls Church. She loved animals, and even bred quarter horses in her youth.

With the help of Monsignor Cosby and a few close friends and family members, Arlene surprised her husband Tom by converting to Catholicism in 1995. This decision proved to be a great source of strength to her as she battled 18 years of cancer and cardiac challenges.

Arlene and Tom were happily married for 47 wonderful years. As a testament to their deep and abiding love, Arlene died at home on March 7th, 2013 literally

in her husband's arms. Thanks to the kindness and spiritual direction of Father Augustine Tran, Arlene continually prayed the *Our Father* during the last few months of her life.

This new scholarship is called the Arlene C. Tate Memorial Scholarship. It is Mr. Tate's desire that this scholarship be used to provide financial assistance to a new or current student in need. We are grateful to Mr. Tate for his generosity to Saint James Catholic School and are proud to honor the memory of such a beautiful and accomplished woman.





Arlene was a very special woman who was known for her intelligence, kindness, good taste and style. She had a distinguished 30-year career in government service as a procurement officer, principally for NASA. Arlene was responsible for procurement for the Lunar Landing Training Vehicle that the Apollo astronauts used for moon landings. She worked closely with many of the Apollo astronauts, including her friend Neil Armstrong whom she car pooled with before he was picked to fly his lunar mission. Arlene always spoke fondly of her days at NASA Edwards as being the greatest period in the history of American aviation. She remembered Chuck Yeager breaking the sound barrier in the Bell X-1 and Scott Crossfield breaking altitude records in the X-15. She witnessed the first flight of the U-2 spy plane and was there when the YF-12 (later the SR 71) first flew. Arlene used her talents for the good of our country and for that, we are grateful!

# FT3-The REV. MONSIGNOR JOHN J. MCMAHON Memorial Scholarship

to announce that a second endowed scholarship — this one for \$65,000 — has been established for Saint James Catholic School. It is called the *Rev. Monsignor John J. McMahon Memorial Scholarship*. It is named after a beloved priest from the Diocese of Richmond who believed deeply in the importance of Catholic education. Fr. McMahon served as assistant pastor of St. James Parish from 1955 to 1961.

During his short tenure here, Father McMahon cheerfully served the

people of St. James. In 1955, the parish had two active women's groups. One was the Sodality of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a group reactivated in the 1940's by Father Mullarkey that was a thriving women's group of almost 1,000 members. The other women's group was founded in response to the Bishop's call for women to participate in Parish Women's Councils affiliated with the National Council of Catholic Women.

Lather McMahon served as the moderator for both groups (which met on different evenings) and at Father Heller's direction, consolidated them under the title "St. James Sodality Council." Their publication *Tidings* remained in place until 1973 when it was taken over by the Parish Advisory Board and renamed the *Round & About*. The Women's Sodality-Council introduced many wonderful initiatives for the people of St. James. We are grateful to Father McMahon for facilitating its many good works! It is our hope that the *Rev. Monsignor John J. McMahon Memorial Scholarship* will honor the memory of this generous priest and his belief in the importance of Catholic education. It is also our hope that the recipients of this need-based scholarship will have a deep commitment to the truths of the Catholic faith as well as a strong desire to give back to others the gift of a Catholic education in the future. We are grateful to the family of Monsignor McMahon for making this generous scholarship possible.

# WHO WAS MONSIGNOR JOHN J. MCMAHON?

- Ordained to the priesthood of the Diocese of Richmond in 1950, he began his ministry in remote areas of the diocese using the diocesan mission trailer.
- Served as the founding pastor of St. Augustine's Church in Chesterfield County; later appointed pastor of St. Patrick's Church where he chose not to receive a salary.
- Served as diocesan director of Catholic Charities, moderator of the Catholic Interracial Council during the civil rights movement, and board member of the Richmond Chaplaincy Association, Seton House and St. Joseph's Villa.
- Was a champion of Catholic education and worked to make it affordable to all who desired it.
- Died on February 2nd, 1982. Prior to his death. Monsignor McMahon created an endownent to heip fund Catholic schools.


