

On The Way

Joseph: Patron of the Dying

We don't know exactly when Saint Joseph died. We can glean from the Gospels that it was at some point before our Lord's public life. From the Cross, Jesus entrusts His mother to John's care: "When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son!' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother!'" (Jn 19:26-27) This would not have made any sense if Joseph had still been alive. Indeed, in such a case it would have been impious of our Lord to entrust Mary to another.

Further, our Lord's entire public ministry was to reveal His heavenly Father. This revelation reaches its fulfillment in His passion and death, when He is found guilty and crucified precisely for claiming to be the Son of God (cf. Mk 14:61-64). It is fitting that Joseph died prior to Jesus' public ministry so that He could speak exclusively about His heavenly Father.

Indeed, Joseph's death may have been the impetus or occasion for Jesus to leave the tranquility of Nazareth and begin the ministry that would bring Him to the Cross. Jacques-Bénigne Bossuet, the great French orator, describes Joseph as the veil over God's greatest treasures in this world: the Incarnate Word and the Immaculate Conception. With Joseph's death, the veil is removed, and Jesus begins His public life.

Knowing that Joseph died prior to Jesus and Mary, we know also that they would have been present to him at his dying. For this reason, he is regarded as the *Patron of the Dying* or the *Patron of a Happy Death*. The reason is clear: he died as we should all desire to die, in the presence of Jesus and Mary.

Joseph's patronage of the dying highlights the concept of and, indeed, the *hope* for a "happy death." As in the ancient world, so in the modern world (that is, in both the pre-Christian and post-Christian cultures) a happy death is one decided on our own terms, when and how we want it. Just as suicide was acceptable in the ancient world, so now assisted suicide is becoming increasingly accepted in ours. If euthanasia becomes more acceptable, the pressure for the elderly and terminally ill to choose that option will increase. Those who prefer to trust in God's timing rather than to kill themselves will be considered selfish.

A Christian society understands that our lives have been entrusted to us. We are stewards, not masters, of our earthly lives. We did not determine our entrance into this world and neither do we determine our exit. At the same time, our belief in Jesus' death and resurrection means that we do not fear death. Indeed, we pray for a "happy death" – one not on decided on our own terms but accepted with the Sacraments of the Church and in union with God.

The Church has traditionally prayed that we be delivered "from a sudden and unprovided death." That's where Joseph comes in. May he intercede for us – that we pass from this world with the Sacraments of the Church and thus in union with Jesus and Mary.



Church During COVID-19

In keeping with the Governor's executive orders, please observe social distancing and wear a mask when in the church.

Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross farthest from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross.
- The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.

Permanent Translation Change at Mass

Beginning Ash Wednesday the standard conclusion to the *collect* (opening prayer) changed slightly. In the prior translation the priest prayed "Through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever." That has been replaced with "in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever." Notice the "one" is dropped. The reason for this is simple: a greater fidelity to the authoritative Latin. But it also highlights that the "God" in that prayer refers not to the Trinity (as the "one" would suggest) but to Jesus Christ. Thus, we pray through Jesus Who is God. This emphasizes the distinctly Christian manner of prayer: we address God the Father through God the Son. We pray not only to God but *within* God.


Lenten Fasting Requirements

Good Friday is ano bligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. Also, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For Roman Catholics, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon Roman Catholics from age 14 onwards.


