

On The Way

Spouse of the Mother of God

Today begins the Seven Sundays of Saint Joseph – a tradition by which we reflect on the Seven Sorrows and Jovs of Saint Joseph on the seven Sundays leading up to his feast on March 19th. To help foster that devotion, I will take this space to reflect on seven titles drawn from the Litany of Saint Joseph.

Although third in the litany, the most important title for Saint Joseph is Spouse of the Mother of God. Sometimes he is called her "Most Chaste Spouse." All of his other titles and dignities flow from his role as Mary's husband.

First, we have to understand that Joseph and Mary were really married. It wasn't make believe. Yes, they had an unusual marriage, since they never had marital relations. Nevertheless, everything necessary for a marriage was present: in short, the complete gift of themselves to one another. They even, as is necessary for marriage, entrusted their bodies to one another. That this mutual entrustment was never expressed conjugally does not take away from the validity of the marriage.

This means that Joseph and Mary had authentic spousal love for one another. They loved one another as spouses ought to – and, given their holiness, more perfectly than any others. Joseph had the love and affection for Mary that a man should have for his wife. We need get rid of the image of old man Joseph feebly accompanying Mary to Bethlehem, Egypt, and back. That common depiction fails to present the couple as actually married and in love with one another. Yes, Joseph was almost certainly older than Mary. But there is no reason to think that he was for that reason an elderly man.

It is through this union with Mary that Joseph is united to Christ. Only through his marriage to Mary is he Jesus' father. When the angel appeared to Mary and announced that she would conceive and bear the Son of God, she was already legally married to Joseph. Back then they did things differently than we do today (in fact, in the exact reverse). In that culture a couple would be legally wed and only later move in together. So, at the moment of our Lady's conception of Jesus, she was already the wife of Joseph. This means that from the first moment of His life in this world, Jesus the Son of God was already the Son of Joseph.

This is why some titles for Joseph fall short of the truth. "Adoptive Father" or "Foster Father" both imply that Joseph made a decision to adopt Christ. However, there was never a moment in our Lord's life that He was not Joseph's Son. Our Lord is, in a certain sense, the fruit of the marriage between Joseph and Mary because it was under Joseph's chaste love and protection that Mary could both remain a virgin and become a mother.

From this real marriage to Mary, Joseph possesses every affection for Christ that a father should have and likewise assumes every obligation and duty towards Him. In this Joseph fulfills that old adage: The best thing a father can do for his children is to love their mother.


The 2021 Bishop's Lenten Appeal Commitment Weekend is February 6/7

This weekend, Father Scalia will speak at all the Masses regarding the 2021 Bishop's Lenten Appeal. By now, all registered parishioners of St. James Parish should have received a letter from Bishop Michael Burbidge regarding the BLA. This year's theme is *Encourage One Another by Word and Deed* and features the image of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended upon Mary and the Apostles to spiritually strengthen and guide them to preach the Gospel to all nations. As Disciples of Christ, we too, are "commissioned" to spread the Good News of our Lord Jesus and to care for our brothers and sisters in need. One way we can do this is by supporting the BLA, which provides over 40 programs and ministries to those in need in our diocese. Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail

As you know, since the beginning of the pandemic we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross *farthest* from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross. The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.

Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.
