

Catechesis on Creation: The Original Sin

The phrase "original sin" describes two realities. First, that choice of Adam and Eve against God. They – and only they – *committed* original sin. Second the term indicates the *effects* of that choice on us. Although not guilty for having committed it, we are "born with original sin" and suffer its consequences. This week we will address the first meaning and next week the second.

We call the sin of Adam and Eve the "original sin" because it is not only the *first* sin but also the *origin* of all other sins, yours and mine. Indeed, their sin sets the pattern for all subsequent sins. Now, the first sin was a sin of intellectual pride that led to disobedience. But it's important to understand the nature of temptation and how Adam and Eve got there. Because that's how we sin as well.

What comes first is suspicion and envy of God. The devil places doubt in Eve's mind about God's instruction: "Did God *really* say, 'You shall not eat from any of the trees in the garden'?" (Gen 3:1; emphasis added) Then he cleverly insinuates that God is holding something back from Adam and Eve: "You certainly will not die! God knows well that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, who know good and evil" (Gen 3:4-5). The implication is that God is keeping them down, preventing them from becoming like Him. He is thus jealous and protective about his own status; a competitor to be envied, not a Father to be trusted.

From that suspicion and envy Adam and Eve progress to intellectual pride. They decide that they know better than God about how things ought to be for them. They will take things, literally, into their own hands and claim that godlike status that He was withholding from them.

Thus the suspicion, envy, and pride bring them to the specific act of disobedience. Adam and Eve disobey the *only* prohibition that God had given them. That one prohibition was meant to be a reminder of their creaturely limits, that they were not all-powerful gods but creatures that received their existence and life from God. Suspicious, envious, and proud, they rebel against their limits and creatureliness. They grasp for and eat the fruit.

These elements are present in every one of our sins as well: suspicion of God's goodness, doubt about His commands, thinking we know better, and seizing control.

There are other common, repeating elements in this scene. For example, the devil does not address Adam and Eve as a couple, as one flesh, but approaches Eve individually. They allow that division of man and wife that creates the opportunity for temptation and sin. Together they stand, divided they fall. An important lesson for every married couple.

Further, Adam is conspicuously absent – or at least silent – during the whole exchange. Where is he? Why does he allow a fallen angel to speak to his wife? Indeed, some see Adam's failure to protect her – to be a "suitable partner" – as part of the first sin. An important lesson for every husband, that he should his wife's protection and sanctification as the first of his duties.


