

On The Way

Catechesis on Creation: The Effects of Original Sin, I

Last week we considered the first sin. This week we turn to the consequences of that sin. And as the different aspects of the first sin shed light on our particular sins, so the effects of original sin shed light on the fallen world we occupy and the struggles we encounter.

Contrary to what the serpent had promised – You certainly will not die! (Gen 3:4) – the disintegration characteristic of death begins immediately after they eat of the tree: "Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves" (Gen 3:7). Whereas before they were naked and unashamed (cf. Gen 2:25), they are now no longer comfortable in their own skin. They are ashamed about their bodies and about how they look at one another's bodies.

Sin has damaged the original harmony between body and soul. It has introduced a dis-integration that will bring body and soul to their final separation, death. We all experience this disharmony to one degree or another. Our souls and bodies often feel opposed to one another. In extreme circumstances this wound to our human nature can take the form of, for example, anorexia or gender dysphoria.

Then we hear about the disharmony introduced between God and man: "When they heard the sound of the Lord God walking about in the garden at the breezy time of the day, the man and his wife hid themselves from the Lord God among the trees of the garden" (Gen 3:8). The image of God walking about in the garden indicates the intimacy and harmony God intended. Adam and Eve hiding from Him expresses the alienation that sin has produced between them and God. Created for union with God, they now hide from Him.

We suffer this effect as well. Shame about what we've done and sometimes even about who we are causes us to hide from God.

Then we see the disharmony sin has produced between man and woman. God addresses the man first, because he was created first and it was to the man that God first entrusted the command not to eat of the tree. "Have you eaten from the tree of which I had forbidden you to eat?" (Gen 3:11) In an act of great cowardice, rather than taking responsibility for his sin, the man blames the woman and, by extension, God Himself: "The woman whom you put here with me-she gave me fruit from the tree, so I ate it." (Gen 3:12).

Thus has sin introduced disharmony and conflict between man and woman, whose relationship was to be the summit of creation. Whereas Adam once rejoiced in the gift of his wife, he now blames her for his failure. The one who was his perfect complement has now – in his eyes – become a competitor. Unfortunately, so it continues today: husband and wife at odds with one another, viewing each other as competitors rather than one flesh. Worse still is our society's mindset that rejects the beautiful complementarity of man and woman and sees conflict as intrinsic to their relations, and man as always the oppressor.


