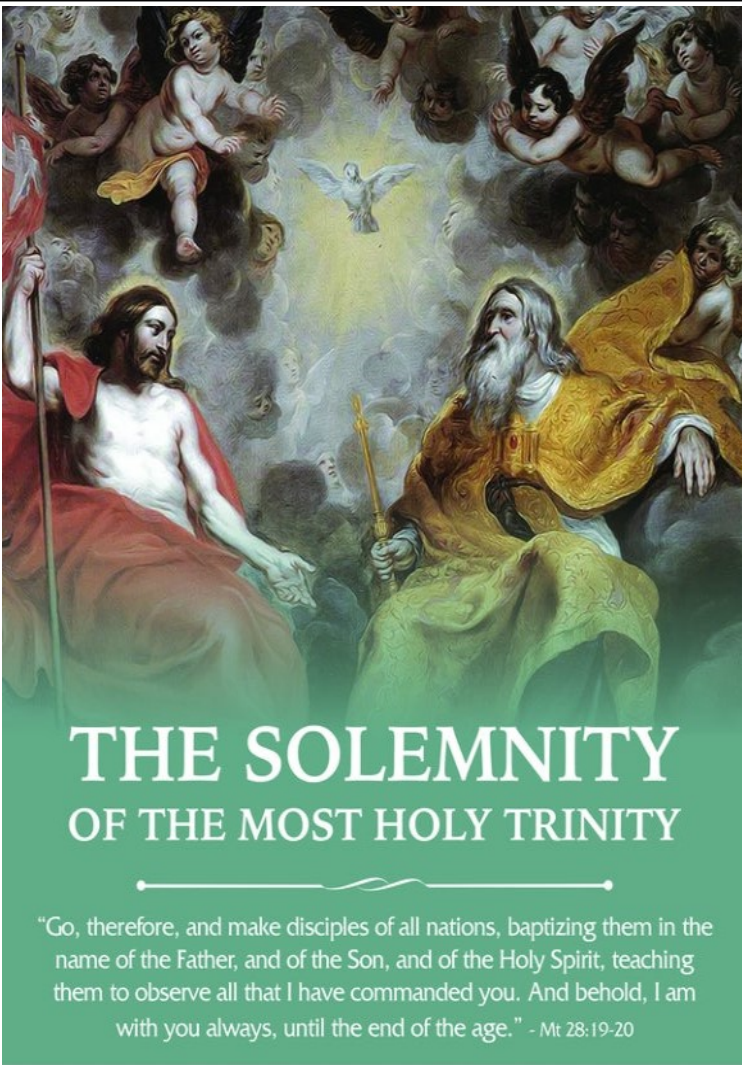

## On The Way

### Catechesis on Creation: Stewardship

In the first two chapters of Genesis, we find two different but complementary descriptions of man's stewardship over creation. In the first account we read, "Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth'" (Gen 1:26). Notice how man's stewardship is directly connected to his being created in the image and likeness of God.

The second account is more descriptive: "And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed...The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die'" (Gen 2:8, 15-17). Notice here how man's stewardship is linked to responsibility (to till and keep the garden) and accountability: he cannot eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

The authentic biblical understanding of stewardship rests on two principles.

The first is misunderstood and therefore unpopular: *hierarchy*. In the act of creation, God establishes a clear hierarchy of being, ascending from inanimate objects, to plants, to animals, and finally to man, God's image and likeness – His representative. Man is the highest being in creation. Hierarchy, however, does not mean domination or tyranny. It means using one's authority to serve the common good.

The second principle is related and is best expressed by Saint Irenaeus's maxim that "The Glory of God is the human person fully alive." God is glorified in this world most of all by our full flourishing as His image and likeness.

Man, therefore, as the highest in the world's hierarchy of being in the world and as God's vice-regent in creation, has dominion over all creation *so that* he can direct it to its final purpose, God's glory. Indeed, all of creation is better and realizes its full meaning when we order it to our common good, which is God's glory.

So, we do have a legitimate authority over creation. It is legitimate for us to harvest plants, slaughter animals for food and clothing, mine minerals, extract fossil fuels, and build nuclear power plants. But authority does not mean license. All of this must be done responsibly – not for selfish gain or mindless pleasure but for authentic human flourishing; not without regard for environmental effects but always with a view to caring for creation.

The abuse of creation is ultimately self-defeating. Not only does it lead to polluting the very environment in which we live, it also distorts our understanding of ourselves. We are part of creation. Once we think we can manipulate and abuse creation for selfish ends and with no accountability, then we will inevitably do the same to ourselves and to one another.

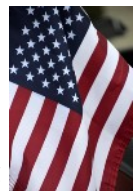

**Church During COVID-19**

In keeping with the Governor's executive orders, please observe social distancing and wear a mask when in the church.

**Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail**

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross farthest from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross.
- The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.

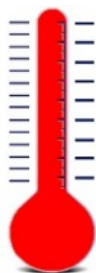

# THE ARLENE C. TATE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

She worked closely with many of the Apollo astronauts, including her friend Neil Armstrong whom she car pooled with before he was picked to fly his lunar mission. Arlene always spoke fondly of her days at NASA Edwards as being the greatest period in the history of American aviation.

Arlene was an elegant dresser who enjoyed playing bridge with her friends and serving as President of various women's clubs including the Women's Club of Falls Church. She loved animals, and even bred quarter horses in her youth. Arlene and Tom were married for 47 wonderful years. Their deep affection and love for one another is truly inspiring. Arlene died peacefully at home on March 7th, 2013 literally in her husband's arms. Thanks to the spiritual direction and kindness of Father Augustine Tran, Arlene continually prayed the *Our Father* during the last few months of her life.

This new scholarship will be called ***The Arlene C. Tate Memorial Scholarship***. It is Mr. Tate's wish that this scholarship be used to provide financial assistance to a new or current student in need. We are truly grateful to Mr. Tate for his generosity to Saint James Catholic School and are proud to honor the memory of such a beautiful, intelligent and accomplished woman.

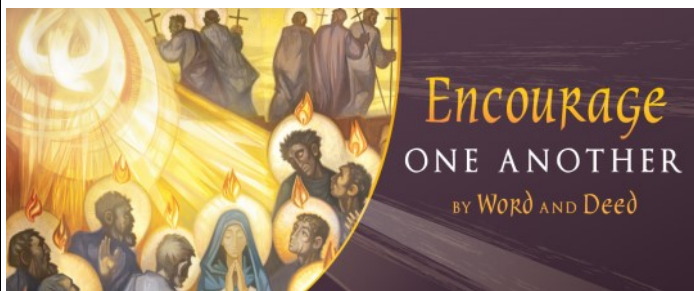

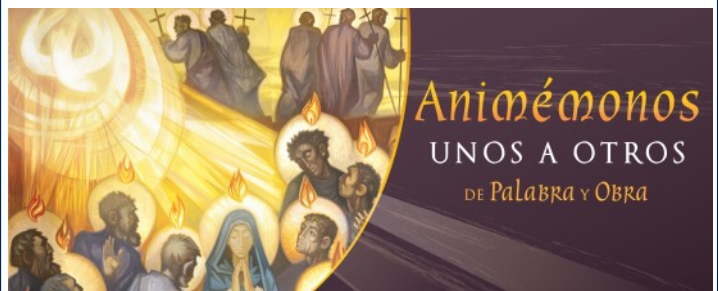
