On The Way

Catechesis on Creation: The Image of God

On the sixth day God created two distinct beings. First, the animals: "And God said, 'Let the earth bring forth living creatures according to their kinds: cattle and creeping things and beasts of the earth according to their kinds.' And it was so...And God saw that it was good" (Gen 1:24-25). After that we hear something that breaks the pattern of the creation narrative: "Then God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (1:26). At no other point during the creation narrative does God pause, reflect, and express His purpose. This break in the pattern signals that He is about to create something different from all other creatures.

That unique creature is man himself, the human person. No other creation account has anything approaching this explanation of who we are and why we exist. That we are created in His image and after His likeness is a truth that resounds throughout history. But what does it mean?

First, to be God's image means that man is God's representative or vice-regent in creation. In the ancient world a ruler would be "present" in his distant lands by way of his carved image or likeness. (Similarly, our nation's chief executive officer is "present" in federal offices across the country by way of the sitting president's portrait found at their entrances.) So, God is present to His creation by way of His image and likeness.

What distinguishes man from all other creatures is his "rational soul." As God has a divine intellect and a divine will, so His image possesses a human intellect and will. Our intellect enables us to know by more than sensory perception. Unlike animals and even plants that might "know" something, we abstract and know truths that cannot be perceived by the senses. The highest and ultimate purpose of our intellect is to know God Himself.

The human person also has a will (what we typically call "free will"). This enables us to choose in a free manner and not by instinct or habit only. Whereas animals act according to instinct (which may at times be trained to a very high degree), we are created to act deliberately, by our own choice. The highest and ultimate purpose of our will is to choose God Himself.

It is because of our rational soul that we are referred to as *persons* – not only creatures, and certainly not things. The human person is an end in himself, not a means to be used for any other end. This is the origin of what we call human rights. Further, as persons we are meant to enter into relationship with other persons. Whereas animals enter into relationships by instinct, we enter into relationship knowingly and willingly, for one another's good.

This might seem to be dry, lifeless stuff. Rational soul, intellect, will, personhood...ho-hum. But it is a fundamental thing and what we all desire: to know that we have a purpose (that alone would be a balm to people in our world) and to know what that purpose is. We are not random evolutionary products. We have been brought into being by a loving God as His image – so that we can grow in His likeness by knowing, loving, and serving Him.

In keeping with the Governor's executive orders, please observe social distancing and wear a mask when in the church.

Receiving Communion at the Communion Rail

Since the beginning of the pandemic, we have been distributing Holy Communion at the altar rail. We find this helps us distribute Communion both reverently and safely. As more people return to Mass it also might take some getting used to. Please make note of these instructions.

- There are Crosses six feet apart along the step of the rail.
- When coming forward for Communion, please go to the Cross farthest from you in your section (i.e. in the center or on the sides).
- Stand or kneel at that Cross.
- The minister will bring you Communion.
- If receiving Communion in the hand, please remove your mask first, then receive the Host.
- Consume the Host while at the altar rail and then return to your seat.
- Please remember that members of the same household do not have to practice social distancing and may stand (or kneel) together at the rail.
- Once those in the transepts have received, those coming down the main aisle should use the spaces on the sides of the communion rail as well as the front.
