

On The Way

Technology and the Tree, Part I

God's command in the Garden of Eden is one of freedom and of prohibition. "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden," He tells Adam. That's a broad freedom. Then He adds the famous prohibition: "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die" (Gen 2:16-17). That's a severe but tightly circumscribed prohibition.

But why include the tree at all? Why include something that needs to be prohibited? The Catechism explains it as follows: The "tree of the knowledge of good and evil" symbolically evokes the insurmountable limits that man, being a creature, must freely recognize and respect with trust. Man is dependent on his Creator, and subject to the laws of creation and to the moral norms that govern the use of freedom.

It's tempting to read these warnings as relics of a past, primitive culture. And yet the God-given freedom and prohibition have important meaning for the digital technology that dominates our lives. Now, there's nothing immoral about the technology itself. Smart phones and smart watches aren't evil. But neither are they neutral. They influence how we live and what kind of people we become. Nor is this unique to the latest technology. Any tool necessarily limits and determines, to a certain degree, how we live and interact and think.

So it's helpful to recall the lesson of the temptation in the Garden (Gen 3:1-7). There is a progression in the fall of Adam and Eve that sounds a warning about technology. The temptation begins with a promise of advancement: "You will be like God," the serpent tells them. Then there is the appeal to the eyes: the tree was "a delight to look at." Next comes the desire for knowledge and power: "the tree was to be desired to make one wise."

Finally, and most importantly, there is the broken promise. Instead of the promised advancement comes debasement. Immediately after Adam and Eve ate the forbidden fruit, "the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves aprons." They were once naked and unashamed (Gen 2:25). Now they cover themselves in shame and hide from God Himself. What promised them advancement brought them instead alienation from themselves, from one another, and from God. In the very act of grasping for something greater, Adam and Eve lose their dignity.

We should make note of that pattern, as a similar threat exists from our technology. There is, first of all, technology's promise of advancement. We've come to expect that technology will constantly advance and take us with it. Then, like the tree, our devices are a constant temptation to our eyes. They are always beckoning to us to look and see. The various alerts cause us to look away from others in front of us and look at the device. Like the tree, our technology promises the knowledge that we equate with power. We have in our pocket or even on our wrist information, data, metrics, and communications that would have been unthinkable not that long ago.

The danger, which we will consider next week, is that in the very act of grasping for technology's promises, we will suffer abasement and not the promised advancement.


Saint James Eighth Grade Raffle
