



Typology: Joseph as a type of Saint Joseph

One of the most important verses regarding Saint Joseph comes from the Psalm written centuries before him: He made him lord over his household, ruler over all his possessions (105:21). Now, that verse applies first to the Patriarch Joseph, son of Jacob. But it realizes its fulfillment in Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary and father of Jesus. The comparison of these two Josephs reveals to us the great dignity of the Husband of

The Patriarch Joseph (cf. Gen 38-50) was the eleventh of Jacob's twelve sons. He was the first child born to Jacob's beloved Rachel and thus his favorite. This predilection was not lost on his older brothers, who resented his special status. They also hated the interpretation of his dreams that someday they would bow down to him. So, they sold him into slavery and thus he made his way to Egypt.

In Egypt Joseph was made head of the household of Potiphar. All was well until Potiphar's wife took an inordinate liking to him. He resisted her advances and defended his chastity. Angered by that, she framed him and had him thrown in prison. But Pharoah exonerated Joseph, bringing him out of prison and establishing him as prime minister of Egypt. Thus, when famine came upon that area of the world, Joseph had authority over one of the most fertile lands and able to assist his brothers in their need.

What does this tell us about the Joseph who would appear centuries later?

First, there's the commonality of dreams. God revealed His will to both men by way of dreams. This is not the usual manner of His revelation (so don't go trying to figure out every last dreams of yours!). But the coming of God to a man as he sleeps indicates that man's great trust in God. For we are never more childlike, vulnerable, and trusting than when we sleen.

Second, chastity. The profound and deep chastity of Saint Joseph is prefigured in the Patriarch's defense of his chastity against the advances of Potiphar's. To capture the depth of his chastity, some theologians speak of the "Virginal Heart of Joseph." The first Joseph suffered imprisonment in defense of his chastity. The second Joseph suffered the suspicion and ridicule for what his townspeople would have presumed was the unchaste conception of our Lord.

Most importantly, both men are entrusted with their master's authority. Pharaoh gave the Patriarch his signet ring, the sign of his authority, and set him as lord over his household, ruler over all his possessions. "Without your approval," Pharoah said, "no one shall lift hand or foot in all the land of Egypt" (Ex 41:44).

But to Saint Joseph a less conspicuous but more extraordinary authority was given: to be head of the Holy Family. He was indeed lord over the household and ruler, not of mere possessions, but of God's greatest loves: Jesus and Mary. As the Patriarch Joseph was entrusted with authority precisely so that he could distribute grain in a time of famine, even more does Saint Joseph have authority to distribute the gifts of God. Perhaps our Lord has Joseph in mind when He speaks of "the faithful and wise steward, whom his master will set over his household, to give them their portion of food at the proper time" (Lk 12:42).



# Saint James Parish

Dear Friends in Christ,

annual report, which has both the FY21 financial report and a summary of our pastoral work. Please take some time to review the report, as it reveals both God's blessings and how we have responded to them.

The past year (like the one before) was anything but normal. Because of the Covid restrictions then in place, our many different parish groups were kept from meeting. Still, we tried to make parish life something approaching normal. We were back in the church for all our Masses. Our parish school opened in September and continued the whole year with in-person teaching, five days a week. Our Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) adopted a hybrid format, with 2nd and 8th grade meeting in-person and the other classes virtually. In the spring, even with the restrictions still in place, we had beautiful First Communion Masses, and received a good number of people into the Church.

Our social outreach continued its good – and creative – work throughout the year, especially the First Friday Food Distribution. And, of course, The Fish Fry Drive-Thru was once again a huge hit (with apologies to our neighbors for the traffic jams in the neighborhood!).

In addition to these spiritual benefits, God blessed us financially as well. You will note a rather healthy surplus on our financial report. In addition to your generosity, there are two significant reasons for this. First, the government's forgiveness of the PPP loan we received. Second, an extraordinary dividend that Bishop Burbidge granted all parishes from Diocesan savings accounts. That gift is set aside for capital expenditures that we have already undertaken.

What are we gong to do with this surplus? Well, first, we're giving some of it away. Similar to last year, we will donate \$50k to our neighboring parish, Saint Anthony of Padua, which serves so many of the poor in our area. Second, we will use most of the surplus to fund many necessary capital improvements around the parish campus in the coming years.

So, here we are, a few months into FY22, and things look good. Both our School and PREP are up and running on a normal schedule. Since the relaxation of Covid restrictions (and the lifting of the dispensation) last June, our Mass attendance has come back to normal. Our different study groups and apostolates have resumed their meetings and activities. Of course, our Social Outreach never missed a beat and continues its good work.

On Sunday, October 31st I will speak on this report at all Masses and will also ask you to make an offertory commitment for the coming year. We still depend on your generosity to continue our good works. But your decision of what to commit should be "inwardly decided" (2 Cor 9:7). Please reflect and pray on your offertory commitment for the coming year. It should be a deliberate expression of your gratitude to God for His gifts and your desire to give back.

Through the intercession of Our Lady and Saint James, may the Lord bless and keep you.

good news, namely Phase 3 of the state
reopening. This meant that the 50% occupancy
limit in places of worship was now lifted, allowing more
freedom for the faithful to attend Mass—no more signups or lotteries—but with masks and social distancing.
It also coincided with new, refurbished doors for our
historic church. Like FY2020, the St. James community
found creative solutions to the challenges of the
pandemic. Social Outreach served the needs of the poor
through its monthly food distributions and partnerships
with Catholic Charities St. Lucy's Project. The Respect
Life Group participated in the Annual Life Chain, the
Knights of Columbus held numerous blood drives, the

Drive-by Fish Fry broke records serving delicious meals to the community, and the Young Professionals hosted the Saint James Ice Cream Social. Our Creation Care Ministry harvested vegetables from July through October and donated their produce monthly to food distribution. Our historic parish school was awarded its third Blue Ribbon of Excellence from the U.S. Department of Education as it opened its doors to an increased number of students. The spiritual life of the parish continued to thrive: multiple novenas were prayed, Lenten retreats were held, and thanks to the ingenuity of Fr. Vu, "reverse confessionals" were implemented to improve ventilation and keep the faithful safe physically and spiritually! Here is a look back at another unforgettable year.

Increased access to Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Confession is now a regular part of the St. James community. We reduced our our livestream schedule to two Sunday Masses for the homebound: 10:30am and 2:30pm. Faith Direct outperformed last year's online gifts by over \$300,000 as many parishioners switched from envelopes to E-giving. Our volunteer ushers, lectors, sacristans, altar servers, collection counters, catechists, cantors and choir members provided invaluable support; they ensured that our liturgies and catechesis remained beautiful, reverent and safe. God bless you all for your outstanding service to St. James!



## Stewardship—The Gift of Time, Talent and Treasure

#### St. James 2021 Annual Report

We hope you enjoyed this year's Annual Report. Please complete the stewardship envelopes mailed to your home (There are extras in the vestibule of the church). In addition to making a weekly or monthly pledge for 2022, you can also update your contact information, sign up for Fr. Scalia's weekly emails and check off areas of interest in serving the parish. Last year, we had some challenges in responding to parishioners who checked off volunteer interests (namely, that so many groups were not meeting). This year, we have a system in place to respond to any envelopes returned to the office.

In FY20, we included a parish survey with our stewardship envelopes that asked you to rank how we best served you during the shut-down. The #1 response was access to the mass via livestream followed by increased hours for adoration and confessions (tied for #2). Next was increased communications via Pastor emails (#3) and the new livestreamed program "Rectory Ramblings" (#4) which received many positive comments from the

faithful. While Website updates (#6) and Facebook posts (#7) were important, they were ranked below a write-in nomination by our parishioners. What was this (#5) write-in? It was the St. James Fish Fry, adapted in less than 24 hours to a COVID-friendly drive through for Lent in 2020 (and in 2021).




