

Typing Lessons: Melchizedek as a Type of Christ

One of the most enigmatic figures in Scripture is Melchizedek. We know very little about him and yet he has great importance. The only actual account of him is a mere three verses: "And Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. And he blessed him and said, 'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!' And Abram

gave him a tenth of everything" (Gen 14:18-20). From this one passage, Melchizedek would occupy Israel's imagination for centuries. Later the Psalmist would write, in a prophecy about the Messiah, "You are a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek" (Ps 110:4). So, this mysterious figure was understood to be an image or *type* of the Messiah; what we know about him would be fulfilled in the Messiah. The letter to the Hebrews applies this to Jesus explicitly: "Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek" (Heb 6:20).

So, what constituted the priesthood of Melchizedek? What are the awaited qualities of the Messiah that he foreshadowed? Well, the little that we know from Genesis provides important information about the One Who is to come: Melchizedek is a king; he is king of Salem, which would later be Jerusalem; since he is king of Salem (i.e. Shalom) he is king of *peace*; in addition to being a king, he is also a *priest*; he offers *bread and* wine.

The letter to the Hebrews adds one more quality: Melchizedek is "without father or mother or genealogy, and has neither beginning of days nor end of life" (Heb 7:3). He appears and disappears from Scripture without any reference to his origin or end.

What we see faintly in Melchizedek we find perfectly and surpassingly in Jesus Christ. First, He is the King of Jerusalem. On Palm Sunday He enters Jerusalem to claim authority over the city. He is also King of Peace. He enters Jerusalem on a donkey, a sign of peace, not on a warhorse. But He establishes peace in a manner never considered or imagined before. By His death He establishes peace between God and man and therefore the possibility of peace among all men.

Jesus Christ is also the Priest, Who offers not just bread and wine but the bread and wine that have become His Body and Blood. At the Last Supper and on the Cross, the true meaning of offering bread and wine is revealed. Melchizedek's humble offering points to Christ's definitive Sacrifice.

Finally, like Melchizedek, Jesus has a priesthood not based on genealogy or inheritance. He "has become a priest, not according to a legal requirement concerning bodily descent but by the power of an indestructible life" (Heb 7:16). Melchizedek's lack of origin and end pointed to a priesthood that was more than human, that had its origins in the Divine. And that is precisely the priesthood of Jesus Christ. It comes to us not by human generation, inheritance, or will, but by the initiative of God Himself.



All families are invited. The Holy Hour will include a guided meditation for the whole family.




