



On The Way

Typing Lessons: Abel as a Type of Christ

Jesus Christ is throughout the Old Testament. We encounter Him in the prophecies about His coming. But perhaps even more we encounter Him in the types – the prefigurements that point to Him. The first type we encounter after the Fall is Abel, the second son of Adam and Eve (cf. Gen 4).

Scripture tells us that Abel was shepherd who brought to the Lord "the firstlings of his flock and of their fat portions" (Gen 4:4). In other words, he gave to the Lord the first born of his flock (in our economic terms, he sacrificed his capital). In particular, he offered a lamb (firstling). The Lord was pleased with his offering but not with his brother Cain's. Out of envy, Cain murdered his brother, whose blood later cries out to God.

So, we have these essentials about Abel: he is a shepherd, who offers a pleasing sacrifice, who is murdered out of envy, and whose blood cries out. Although his story is very brief, it has a profound significance in Israel's narrative. He is the first to offer firstlings, as the Israelites were later commanded to do (cf. Ex 13). He is the first to suffer for his devotion to the Lord, as the Israelites later would. His blood cries out to the Lord, as the groaning of the Israelites would later rise to the Lord's ears (cf. Ex 3).

At the same time, and in a mysterious way, Abel already announces Jesus Christ, Who fulfills the story of Abel in a surpassing manner. Everything that we see in preliminary form in Abel we find writ large in Jesus Christ: sacrifice, murder, and blood.

First, on the Cross our Lord is both shepherd and sheep. He is the definitive shepherd, the Good Shepherd, Who lays down His life for the sheep. At the same time, as an Israelite He is a member of the Lord's own flock – the Lamb of God. Thus, on the Cross He offers Himself as the best of the flock, the Lamb of God, in an act of worship perfectly pleasing to the Father.

Second, although Christ offers His own life on the Cross, He does so through the hands of His persecutors. He is the victim of envy, as was Abel. "It was out of envy that the chief priests had handed him over" (Mk 15:10).

Third, the Blood of Christ cries out to the Father. We are redeemed by His Blood. He establishes the New Covenant (New Testament) in His blood. The letter to the Hebrews makes the Jesus/Abel connection explicit. It speaks of Jesus as "the mediator of a new covenant" whose "sprinkled blood... speaks more eloquently than that of Abel" (Heb 12:24).

In noting these similarities, we should appreciate even more the differences. Abel offered a sacrifice apart from himself; Jesus offered Himself as the Lamb. Abel lost is life; Jesus gave His. Abel's blood cried out for vengeance; Jesus' appeals to the Father for mercy.

The next time at Mass you hear the words "the gifts of your servant Abel the just," keep in mind the ancient and profound reference to a figure who announces Christ and whose simple offering helps us to appreciate Christ's divine offering.


Parish Religious Education Program (PREP) for High School






