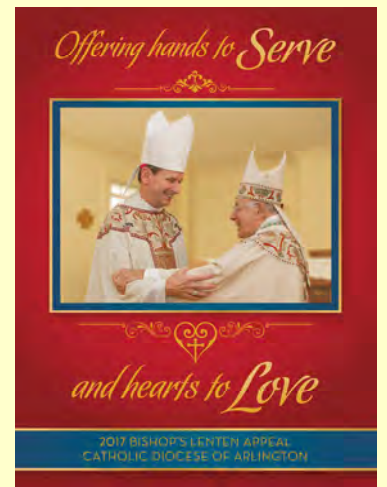

From Our Deacon



In this year's high school parish religious education program (PREP) we are seeking creative ways of finding the Catholic faith in our culture. Since September, we have been gathering each week to watch the award-winning film, *The Fellowship of the Ring*. Then, we discuss the various Christian themes that we find embedded in this popular story by the popular Catholic author JRR Tolkien.

As we come to the end of *The Fellowship of the Ring*, two important female characters are introduced to a story that has mostly been dominated by men. When considered through the lens of Catholicism, these two women — the elf maiden, Arwen, and the queen of the woodland elves, Galadriel — both remind us in meaningful ways of our Blessed Mother, Mary.

Arwen appears in the story just after the group narrowly survives an attack by a group of evil Ringwraiths. As an image of Mary, Arwen brings a heavenly light in the darkness of the Fellowship's despair and points the way for the group to find rest and protection "in the House of her Father." She willingly carries the injured, helpless hobbit Frodo through the wilderness on horseback. Violent Ringwraiths make chase. Arwen evades them, not by matching their violent power, but by deftly maneuvering away from them; just as the Blessed Mother carried the infant Jesus away from the violence of King Herod on a donkey. She prays for Frodo to be healed, not through her own powers but, instead, through the graces that she has been given.

The other significant icon of Mary in the story, Galadriel, is introduced as a great and wise queen. She, too, is bathed in light as she sees the hearts of the men of the Fellowship and offers them insights and guidance to restore their hope in their dangerous mission. She sustains the Fellowship by generously giving them gifts and encouraging them to use a great river to speed them along their way. As water is a symbol of grace in the story, Galadriel is, like Mary, the Queen of Heaven, revealing how to ease their journey by moving in harmony with grace and the Holy Spirit.

In these characters, JRR Tolkien reveals his deeply Catholic faith and provides us with a wonderful reminder of the gift given to us in our Blessed Mother, Mary. Like Arwen, Mary provides light to banish despair in our lives and helps guide us through the wilderness to her Son... who provides us with refuge, healing, and rest. Like the Lady Galadriel, the Blessed Mother offers insights and guidance to those who ask for it, restoring our hope and showing us how to maneuver through the challenges of this life on the pathways of grace.

If you are a high school student and would like to hear more, we meet most Tuesday evenings in the school library. In early March, we will begin reviewing a new movie — the 2012 hit, *The Hunger Games*. If you've been considering it, this is a great time to join us for fun, faith, and fellowship! 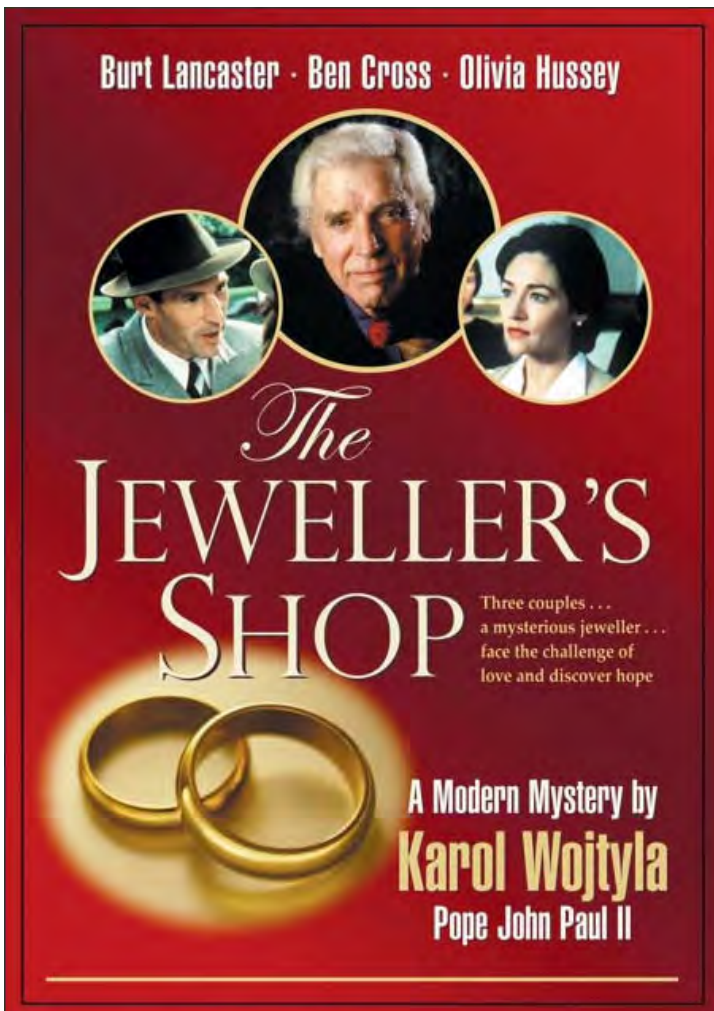

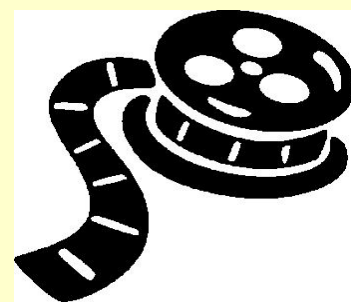

1902— Article in the *Washington Post* on the Laying of the Cornerstone of St. James

The Washington Post sent reporters to cover both the laying of the cornerstone and the dedication of the new stone church of St. James. They published the wrong name in the cornerstone story, probably because the original community had been a mission of St. Mary's in Alexandria. "Tennallytown" is now known as Tenleytown, a neighborhood in Washington, DC.

LAID THE CORNER-STONE

Impressive Ceremonies at the Site of St. Mary's, at Falls Church.

The ceremonies of laying the corner-stone of St. Mary's, the new Catholic Church in process of erection at Falls Church, Va., took place yesterday afternoon at 4 o'clock, and were interesting and impressive. The services were conducted by Rev. Father Tearney, pastor of the church, assisted by Rev. Father Cutler, of Alexandria; Rev. Father Mallon of Tennallytown; Father Quill, S.J., and Father O'Leary, S.J., of the Georgetown University, and Father Cahill, S.J., of Trinity Church, Georgetown.

A procession consisting of societies, the clergy, altar boys and Knights of Columbus, of Washington and Alexandria, marched from the pastor's residence to the site of the new church. The chanting of hymns, the sprinkling of the foundation walls with holy water, and an appropriate sermon by Father Sullivan, of the Paulist Fathers, followed by a hymn of thanksgiving, completed the ceremonies.

A large number of persons attended the ceremonies from Washington, Alexandria, and the surrounding country.

The church will be built of stone at a cost of \$20,000, which has been donated by Mrs. Thomas F. Ryan, of New York.
