From Our Pastor



If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday.
Isaiah 58:10

Have you ever met a true optimist? Someone who literally emanates positivity? I am not talking about someone who is naive or unrealistic, but rather a person whose heart is so full of love – for Christ, and in turn, others – that this love cannot be hidden “beneath a bushel.” I have been blessed to have many examples in my own life. These people are not saints; they are human beings like the rest of us, with faults and failings. Indeed, in acknowledging their own shortcomings, they reveal the power of God within us. This is Paul’s message in the second reading: through Christ he becomes strong; through him the grace of Christ is seen.

By word, deed, and presence those who allow Christ to live in and through them are able to overcome fear, anxiety, sadness, and yes even anger and disappointment. I have seen spouses revel in each other’s company, even when one is ravaged by disease. I have seen a young couple take in a family of six to live in their one-bedroom apartment because the family had nowhere else to go - and not just for a night, but for more than a month. I have seen parishioners give immense amounts of their time and energy delivering food and comfort, regardless of weather, to those in need. I have seen the generosity of those who, without fanfare, wanting neither recognition nor acknowledgment, pay tuition for a family suffering a crisis. Each day I see acts, both small and large, of immense kindness and gentleness with those who come to us. Acts as simple as a smile, a sincere inquiry as to someone’s health, or a hug.

Our reflection question from *Light Your Heart with the Word* asks us to consider ways we can move our faith from pew to pavement; from church (with a little “c”) to Church – to a diverse and encompassing humanity. We sing together that “they’ll know we are Christians by our love,” but how do we sing this song outside of church? Sometimes fear keeps us from truly living out the Beatitudes. We are afraid of that to which we don’t easily relate. For example, the homeless person we see frightens us. It’s hard to get past tattered clothes or missing teeth. The long-standing argument is easier to uphold because communicating honestly and showing mercy and forgiveness grates; perhaps it means we lost. But in denying mercy to others we are the ones who loose.

We don’t always have to make the grand gesture; small acts build upon themselves. As a well known ad shows, these acts can “pay it forward.” By your actions and responses you can inspire those who you’ve never met. You could provide that teachable moment to parents (and adults alike). It doesn’t necessarily begin every day, but as with anything in life, repetition begets habit. Let’s be determined to start a habit we won’t ever break. God bless.

Scouting at St. James

Girl Scouts

We are blessed to have over 100 active Girls Scouts from Kindergarten through High School. Girl Scouting is a great experience for girls to meet new friends, explore the outdoors, learn new skills, and serve others. We strive to build girls of courage, confidence, and character. Our Saint James Girl Scouts have been busy this year doing service projects and volunteering in our local community in many ways. They adopted families at Christmas time; prepared and served meals to 40 families in need; collected candy at Halloween for the Medical Mission of Mercy in Isabel, Philippines; participated in the Crayon Initiative by collecting used crayons from St. James School and local restaurants that were recycled into new crayons and donated to schools, hospitals, and art programs; participated in Stop Hunger Now to send packaged food to Haiti; and sent care packages to our military through the Adopt a Solider program.

In addition to service activities, the Girl Scouts have also enjoyed camping, hiking, horseback riding, attending live theater events, and hosting a STEM program about working in the field of science. Notably, the 6th grade troop won the "most creative" entry in the "Celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Girl Scout Cookies" cookie challenge. All troops have been preparing for cookie sale season where they learn and utilize goal setting, money management, decision making, and people skills. Additionally, our Girl Scout Troops are gearing up to represent different countries and cultures at World Thinking Day in February.



Boy Scouts

Troop 681 from St. James currently has 62 boys from grades 6-12. We have an active program encouraging the scouts to advance through the ranks of Scouting. We appreciate the parish members support of our annual Christmas Tree sale. The proceeds allow us to subsidize an active summer program which includes summer camp and high adventure programs. This past summer we had two crews on 70 mile hikes at the Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. The scouts help out each year with the Parish Picnic and the School Bazaar. They also participate in the annual Scouting for Food canned food drive and prepare a meal for Christ House each spring. Upcoming events include several cold weather camping trips and a ski trip in West Virginia.

American Heritage Girls

The American Heritage Girls have had a very busy year! While working on the Year of Mercy Patch, we put Christ's mercy in action with a number of service projects! We greeted Veterans at Dulles Airport through the Honor Flight Program; we packed art therapy boxes for hospitalized children through an organization called KraftLove; we cooked, donated, and served dinner to the needy at Christ House in Alexandria, and we headed to a less traveled National Cemetery this year - US Soldiers' and Airman's Home in Washington DC, where we laid over 850 wreaths (sold by our troop) on the graves of deceased veterans. We also had lots of fun! We heard from three veterans about their experiences in the military as we worked on our Freedom's Heroes badge. Because it was an election year, we also heard from a parent who works on Capitol Hill to help us complete the Citizenship and Government Badge. Our AHG girls also did some archery, climbing, and camping!

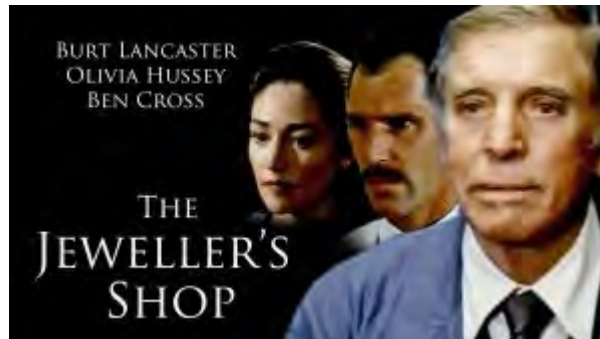

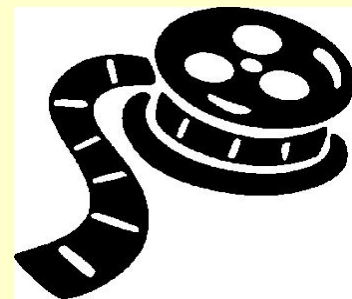

1902 - FATHER TEARNEY AND THE PEOPLE BUILD A NEW CHURCH

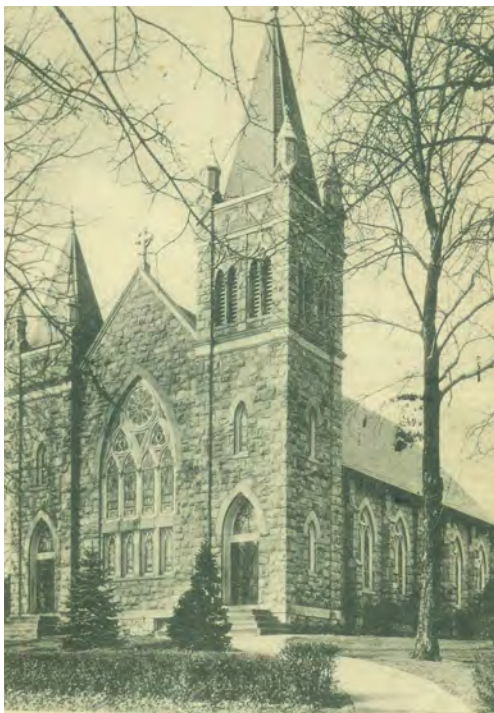
SITE: Near the railroad depot in the West End of Falls Church on part of the old Sherwood tract. Though the railroad no longer exists, the church still stands on the same site.

DESIGN: Designed by parishioner A.O. VonHerbulis,* "an architect of some note who lived near the church." The VonHerbulis family lived at the site of St. Joseph Preschool. He is buried in St. James Cemetery.

BUILDER: Thomas Hillier. At the time it was constructed, the church was called the "best example of Gothic architecture in the state." The native sandstone of the exterior was quarried in the village.

COST: According to a Washington Post story on the dedication of the church, the entire cost was donated by Mrs. Thomas Fortune Ryan, wife of a New York millionaire financier. The Ryans financed many Catholic projects on the East Coast.

**A. O. VonHerbulis, known to his friends as "Otts," had one of the first television sets in the neighborhood. A former parishioner remembers being invited as a child to watch a football game at the VonHerbulis home.*

EARLY EVANGELIZATION: The story is from the recollections of early parishioner Eugene Shreve (1899-1990), who was in the initial first grade class in St. James School. "Father belonged to the M. E. Church [Methodist], South, and our Mother was a member of St. James Catholic Church. When the latter parish undertook the building of a new church in 1902, Father volunteered his services and a team of horses to help the men of the congregation in the project. By manpower and horsepower they excavated the site for the stone church. ... He became acquainted with Fr. Frederick Lackey who was Assistant Pastor of St. James at that time, and a lasting friendship developed. After thoughtful deliberation, (Father) was instructed in the Catholic faith and converted."
