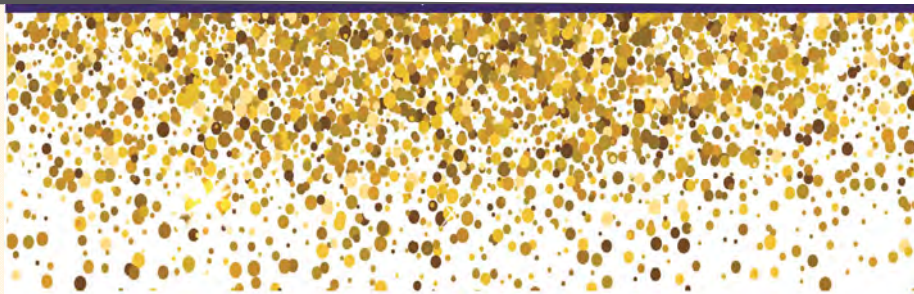

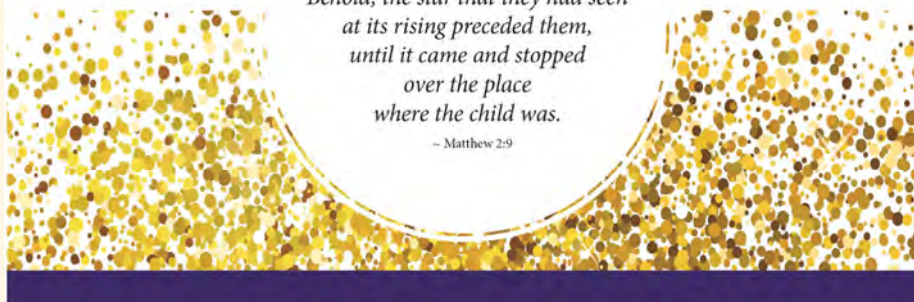

From Our Pastor



"Rise in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you!" (Is 60:1)

Isaiah's rallying cry was to a people defeated and exiled by the Babylonians. After the Babylonians' subsequent defeat at the hands of the Persians, the Jews were allowed to return, but to what? A homeland ruined by war and a temple destroyed. In the passage just before this reading we hear of the Israelites "walking in darkness." Their transgressions had kept them "separate from God." Yet their sufferings would not be in vain. God Himself would intervene to save them; to offer a covenant: Jerusalem will be great again. It will once

again become the center of spirituality for the world. "Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance." (Is 60:3)

Today we remember the Magi's visit to the Christ child with the Feast of the Epiphany, the fulfillment of Isaiah's promise that *"the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the Lord."* (Is 60:6) This feast, one of the oldest of Christian feasts, is not just a bookend to our Christmas celebrations. It is one of the most important in our liturgical calendar, for in the Epiphany, (which literally means "to reveal" in Greek) Christ is revealed as the Savior of the world, the realization of the ancient covenant. To Gentiles, as well as Jews, the Christ has come. *We are, as St. Paul says, "co-heirs" to salvation.* The Magi represent this awesome fact, as well as the longing, we all feel to find meaning and purpose in our existence. Epiphany is not just about gold, frankincense, and myrrh; it is about God's plan for the entire human race.

This idea that the savior would come for kings and shepherds alike, for the Chosen People of Israel as well as the Samaritans is more than just words. It is a revolutionary concept. I am saved just as much as any person in the pew next to me. My soul, known to God more closely than any spouse, parent or friend could know, has worth regardless of my earthly riches, or lack thereof.

As we celebrate Epiphany, the prophet's words ring true. Jerusalem once again became the center of spirituality, Christ the ultimate expression of God's covenant with all people. By Jesus's passion, death, and resurrection, we who were in exile in our sinfulness, now, by the Cross and mercy of God, can be forgiven of our sins and given the hope of eternal life. Foretold by Isaiah, even though "darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples," we will now "be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow," with God's mercy and grace.

I would like to thank everyone who helped make our Christmas celebrations so beautiful. I am especially grateful to Dan Day, our choirs and cantors, sacristans, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and ushers who welcomed families and visitors to meet Christ, from the front door to the altar. My deep gratitude to Linda Doyle, Donnamaria Duatschek, Estela Arciaga, Lori Koch, Jonie Lisbeth, Jane Harvey, Kathy Tresnicky Wilbur, Emily and Vince Dufrane and Miguel Cruz whose efforts made the Church so beautiful.

In this week's video, Jim Beckman offers some context to the journey of the Magi and Herod's fearful response to the news they carried. Since Herod himself was not a Jew, he was afraid that Jesus would take his place. The magi, on the other hand, responded with faith to the signs and prophecies they saw and made an offering of their most valuable gifts to the child Jesus. Similarly, at Mass we listen to the Word of God and respond by offering ourselves to Jesus, now present in the Eucharist.

Reflection Question: How can you offer Jesus the gift of yourself in your daily life?

In this week's reading, John the Baptist tells us that there is only One who has the answer—Jesus. Take some time this week to examine your heart and determine where you are listening to the voices of the world and where you are listening to the Word of the Lord.

1892–2017

1874 – ST. JAMES MISSION AND FRAME CHURCH



The white clapboard church with a 66 foot bell tower would be at home in any New England town. But this one was in a small southern village, recovering from war, in an area where land was cheap and railroads and sawmills attracted workers. St. James had been named a mission from St. Mary's in Alexandria in 1874; Father Dennis O'Kane, SJ, came to say Mass in the home of the Sewall family on West Street and in the Taylor home.

Mrs. Gibson (Victoria) Terrett began soliciting funds for the church in May 1873, encouraged by the bishop of Richmond, James Gibbons. By September, Mrs. Terrett had collected \$126.00 to hand to Father O'Kane. Construction began that same year on a field the Sewall family gave to Bishop Gibbons for a dollar. That land is the present site of our cemetery on West Street, where the earliest graves are dated 1866 and 1868. Bishop Gibbons dedicated the little church on October 18, 1874. The railroad ran a special train to bring people from Alexandria, Georgetown and Washington to join the local community for the event. The Catholics of Falls Church had a home in St. James!

IT'S A MYSTERY! WHY ARE THE EARLIEST GRAVES IN OUR CEMETERY DATED BEFORE ST. JAMES WAS EVEN NAMED A MISSION? ACCORDING TO CEMETERY RECORDS, MARGARET I. BURKE DIED IN 1866 AT AGE 19, AND BENNET CARROLL WAS 70 WHEN HE DIED IN 1868. BOTH ARE BURIED IN ST. JAMES CEMETERY.
