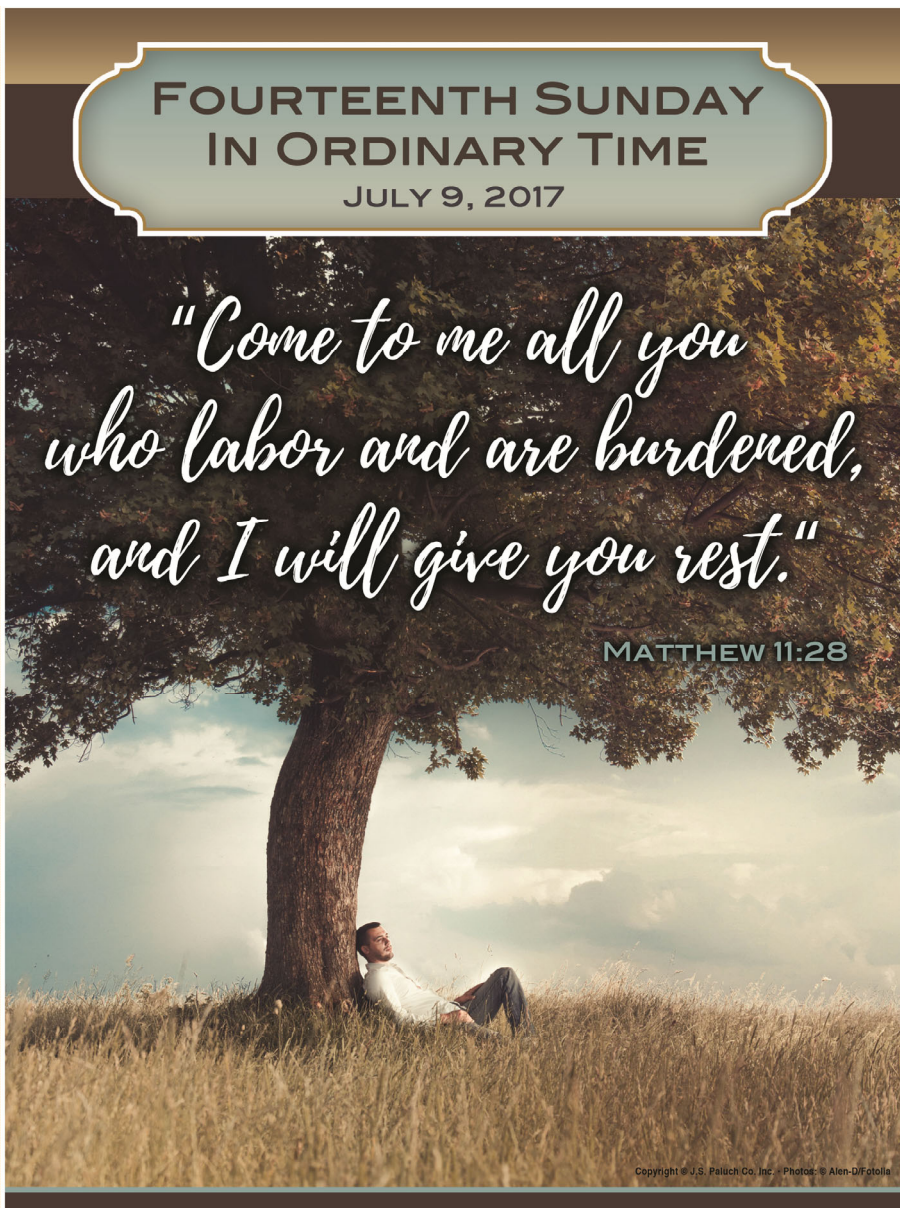

From Our Seminarian



“Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.” Matthew 11:29

The time of Christ was a period of relative peace throughout the known world. Caesar had conquered much of the Mediterranean to establish his empire. Caesar was also known for building roads that connected the known world from end to end. This time of greater peace and unity in the ancient world is a period called the Pax Romana, Latin for the Roman Peace.

The readings today remind me of the unity and peace of a great nation like Rome during the Pax Romana. But just as the ways of God are not the ways of man, the kingdom of God is not like the kingdoms of man. In the book of Zechariah, our first reading, we hear a prophecy of peace. The elements of war will be laid aside and there will be a king who reigns, but this king will be meek. He will not come on a chariot like we might imagine from movies, but with humble simplicity riding a donkey. This of course is the prophecy fulfilled by Jesus Christ on Palm Sunday. The beautiful paradox of our faith is that God will raise up those who are bowed down. This paradox when completely lived out is absolutely contrary to the ways of the world. Living a simple life, doing small things with great love, and always reminding ourselves how Christ lived is what will help us live as we ought. We should live following the Holy Spirit.

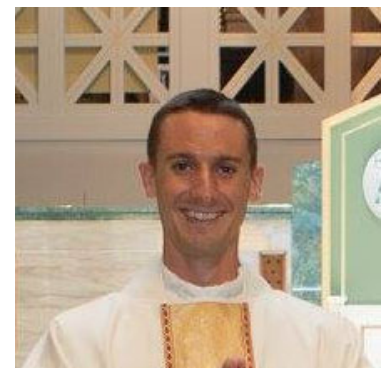
This is exactly what St. Paul in his letter to the Romans asks us to do. Not to live by the flesh, namely our appetite to be seen as great by others, but to live with the Holy Spirit, to live as Christ did. In our baptism we die to the flesh and are reborn in the spirit. We are meant to live with the same spirit as Christ, the Holy Spirit. We are meant to have life, a joyous life where we know Christ’s love, His mercy, His care, His constant calling of us to be with Him, and His taking on our burdens. If we live in His Holy Spirit we are promised this type of life.

The Christian life is to live with the Holy Spirit. While at work, cooking dinner, on the soccer field, visiting our friends, or driving, we are meant to act as Christ would. When we meditate on who Christ is, we will know His Spirit. So the Gospel that we meditate on this week gives us a chance to understand who Jesus is. This Sunday, Christ makes it easy for us. He tells us to be meek and humble of heart. To conquer the world we must be meek and humble, not as a Caesar but as a Christus. Christ lived as a sign of contradiction, and that is what he asks us to do. Pax Christi may appear the same as Pax Romana with peace and wide borders, but it is achieved only by humility. The unity of the world comes from everyone living according to how Christ did and how His Holy Spirit guides us. The territory gained is not geographical, but it is our souls.

What does the Church teach about immigration?

Week #6: Family unification

The Catholic Church believes that immigrants should come to the United States lawfully, but it also understands that the current immigration legal framework does not adequately address the needs of families separated by national borders. The Church supports immigration reform that would increase the number of visas available to facilitate family reunification. Everyone should know her as Coco's personal assistant. His fancy wardrobe of colorful jackets and slickers, not to mention his Saint James School attire, are due to her largesse. Sister Marlene has been with us for seven years, providing not just stellar teaching but kindness to her students. They learned to love school and love God even more. Sister's next assignment will be at the Saint Monica Early Learning Center where she will teach religion.

Sister Helen Maureen loved Saint James so much she returned to us after many years away. Sister's first assignment was as principal of our school. She was at once an amazing administrator and loving presence. Each child received their report card from her with a kind word of congratulations or encouragement. She proudly displayed the latest writings from her students outside her office door. In 1981 she celebrated the School's 75th anniversary. Sister returned to us four years ago to serve as our Minister to the Sick & Homebound. Here she brought her gentle demeanor, love of the Eucharist and wicked Irish humor to all she met. Sister read each prayer intention, giving every one the same thoughtful attention. We have been lucky to have her not just once but twice in our parish. Sister is taking up residence at Camilla Hall, the Order's retirement community. She will continue to serve in her ministry with the sick by visiting IHM Sisters who have Alzheimer's while allowing time for some well-deserved breaks.



Familiarity can sometimes breed complacency. We can take for granted those around us who have been with us for so long. Our IHM Sisters have been here nearly a century serving our children and the entire parish. Their Gospel witness goes before them. Their example lives in our hearts and minds long after they leave us. Let us give thanks for Sisters Marlene and Helen Maureen and for all the wonderful Sisters past and present whose daily sacrifice enriches our lives. Please thank both Sisters and wish them God speed.

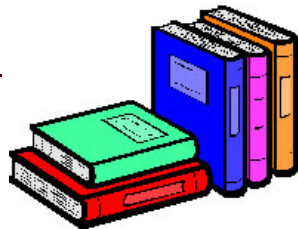

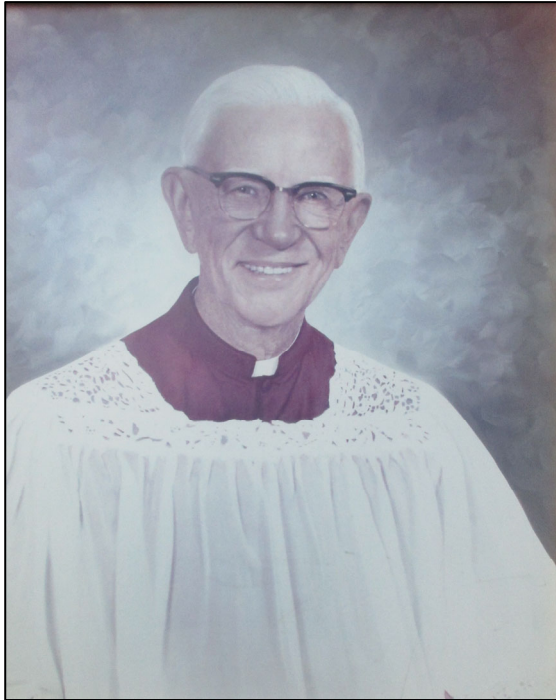

1953-1977 - FATHER HELLER BECOMES THE FIFTH PASTOR AT ST. JAMES



Rev. Monsignor Paul V. Heller
Fifth Pastor 1953-1977

Rev. Paul V. Heller was pastor of St. James from 1953 until 1977, and lived here as pastor emeritus until his death in 1982. He is buried with his parents in Martinsburg, West Virginia, where he was born in 1901.

Father Heller was ordained in 1933, and as a new priest in Winchester, Virginia, he served the men in the Civilian Conservation Corps camps in the nearby Blue Ridge Mountains. He told a parishioner friend about being snowed in at a CCC camp for three days, dreading his late return to the parish, only to be greeted by the pastor, "Thanks for bringing my car back before the spring thaw."

Father Heller then spent 13 years as assistant pastor at Sacred Heart in Norfolk. Moved by the plight of orphaned and abandoned children during those World War II years, he founded and directed St. Mary's Infant Home. More than 70 years have passed, and St. Mary's has become St. Mary's Home for Disabled Children, a place where "children and young adults -- ages newborn to 21 -- from all across Virginia live, play and go to school....The only place like it in Virginia."

In 1947, Father Heller became pastor of St. James in Hopewell, Virginia. In 1953, he came to our St. James in Falls Church. He celebrated the 25th anniversary of his ordination here in 1958, and was given the title Monsignor by Pope John XXIII in 1961. The 24 years until he retired in 1977 were rich years for St. James and for the whole Church. Look for stories of those years in the weeks ahead.
