From Our Pastor



"Do not forget the LORD, your God ... who brought forth water for you from the flinty rock." (DT 8:11,15) "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." (JN 6:51)

In the weeks following Pentecost the Church reminds us that though Christ ascended into heaven, He remains with us – through the inspiration and guidance of the Holy Spirit and the physical presence of the Holy Eucharist. It is not happenstance that we now focus on these two important aspects. The early Church, left bereft for want of Christ in their daily lives, was not however, adrift. Christ left the disciples with the very things which would give them sustenance

and strength. Just as from the rock came the living waters which saved the Israelites in the desert, so too from the Cross came the living bread which saved us all.

Most of us have been fortunate never to have experienced true hunger. But all of us can relate to feeling those pangs to some extent and the feeling of satisfaction when we finally have that piece of food. We need the proteins, vitamins, minerals etc. to live; we need the energy from our food to function. We know the difference in how we feel after a good meal: we can tackle those exams, that project, that long drive into work.

The Eucharist is our spiritual mainstay; it fills not our stomachs but our souls. Just as though we gain repeated strength from our meals, we gain grace the more we partake in this, our most important sacrament. At the altar we meet Christ and He meets us, with all our faults and anxieties and we do so as a community. Communion then becomes a literal thing, as we, a fellowship of faith, come one by one to receive Christ personally into our lives. His presence in the Body and Blood are the vehicles to grace. We can, then, not only take those exams but we can face the trials born out of illness or separation, anger or hurt. We can go out from our pews and not just function as human beings, but live as Gospel witnesses.

My sisters and brothers, do not just go through the motions at Communion. As you receive, truly think upon the sacrifice made on your behalf that has brought you to this table. Open your hearts to Christ; allow His living presence to infuse your life. There is no expiration date on this spiritual food, no shelf life to its worth, no body it cannot heal.

I am happy to introduce Robbie Renner, our diocesan seminarian who will be with us this summer. I am grateful to Bishop Burbidge for sending young men such as Robbie to our parish to learn, to grow and to serve. Robbie is currently studying at Mount Saint Mary's Seminary and comes to us from Holy Spirit Parish. Please join me in welcoming him to Saint James.

From Our Bishop Regarding Church Teaching on Immigration

What does the Church teach about immigration?

There are more than 11 million undocumented immigrants presently in the United States. Each year, approximately 300,000 more enter the country. Yet there are only 55,000 green cards available annually in the lottery, known as the Diversity Visa program. With few exceptions, these immigrants are hardworking, honest, faithful people simply desiring the opportunity to make a better life for themselves and their families. The United States is a nation of immigrants; a review of the history of our own families and of our nation reminds us of the need to welcome the stranger in our midst.

En la actualidad hay más de 11 millones de inmigrantes indocumentados en los Estados Unidos. Anualmente, otros 300.000 ingresan al país. Sin embargo, hay solo 55.000 tarjetas de residencia disponibles anualmente en la lotería conocida como el programa de visas de diversidad (*Diversity Visa Program*). Con pocas excepciones, estos inmigrantes son trabajadores dedicados, honrados y fieles que sencillamente desean tener la oportunidad de lograr una vida mejor para ellos y para sus familias. Los Estados Unidos son una nación de inmigrantes; un repaso de la historia de nuestras propias familias y de nuestro país nos recuerda la necesidad de acoger al extranjero en nuestro medio. The Rectory

The original frame church of the Saint James Mission and later Parish was located on the corner of Fowler Street and South West Street, now the land of St. James Cemetery. The house adjoining the property (on Fowler Street), once the home of the Lightfoot family, was the Rectory.

A.O. Von Herbulis who designed the 1902 stone church also designed the Rectory located next to the Church. Thomas Hillier was contractor and builder for both the 1902 stone church and the Rectory. During the 1951 enlargement of the original stone church under Philadelphia architects Gleason and Mulrooney with construction led by parishioner A. P. DiGiulian's company, the cruciform church we have today was completed. The Rectory was moved to its present location and enlarged at that time.
