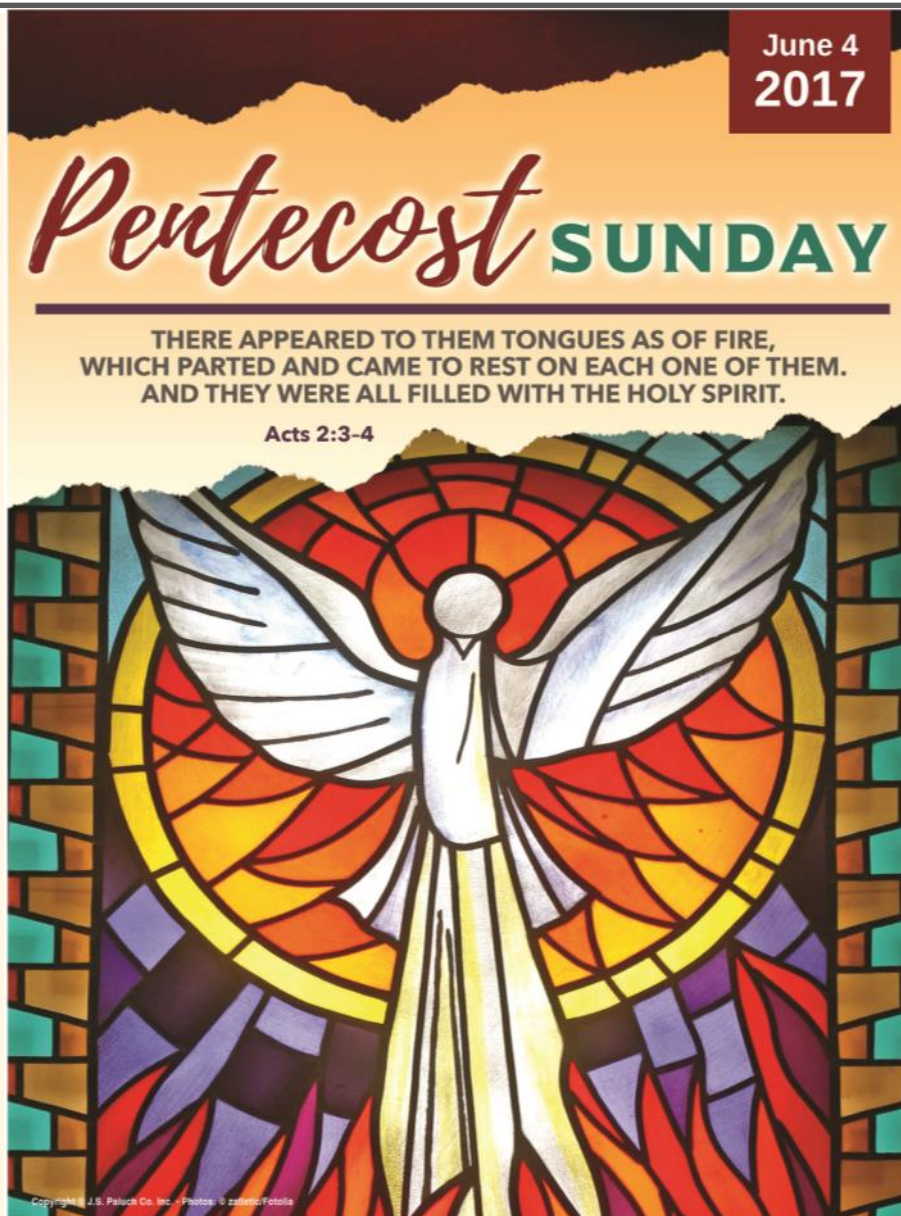

From Our Pastor



“At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language” Acts 2:6

Have you ever sat in a noisy restaurant trying to listen to a friend sitting just across from you? Or been on your cellphone, barely able to hear from all the static? Our world is noisy. And busy. And distracting. It's easy to get pulled away from what is important, just in front of us. But amidst the clamor, God is beckoning each of us to live our baptismal call to its fullest. The Feast of Pentecost reminds us that God speaks above the din *directly to us*. However, we can only hear Him when our hearts are open to His words. If we are not ready to truly listen for Him, God becomes just another source of interference in our lives.

That call, and how it is revealed, is personal; its meaning particular to each individual and is not without support. We are endowed with gifts enabling us to answer Him, but which also are to be shared. Saint Paul reminds us, *“to each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit.”* Each one of us has been marked by God with talents unique only to us in the way we use them. Just as George Bailey in the film, *“It's a Wonderful Life,”* came to understand that each life leaves an imprint on another, so too our talents fill voids within our families and our communities. Maybe you can sing; maybe you are a great organizer; perhaps you are known for your compassion, calmness, leadership. Pulled together, individual talents can go on to do great things. They can cure an illness; win a championship; inspire a faith, and build a church which will last for centuries.

You may read this thinking, *“I can do none of that.”* But you can build a community of love and forgiveness in your home, your workplace, your community. You can share your love of music and bring comfort to a sick child, or joy to a liturgy. You can share your leadership talents or your organizational skills and create a smooth running workplace or volunteer group. You can share the compassion of Christ within your family and make an environment focused on mercy. You can take this compassion out beyond the walls which surround our daily living, and reveal true Gospel witness to all.

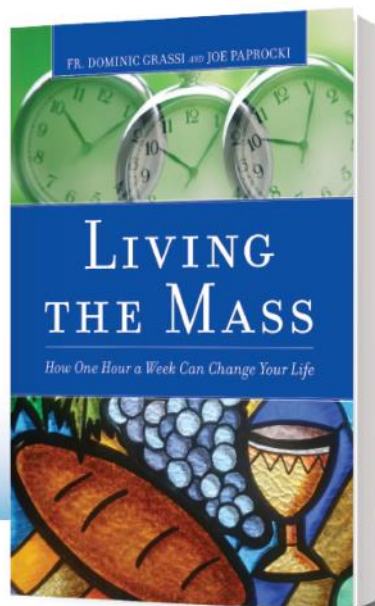

This year we are celebrating our 125th anniversary with events, our oral history project and a weekly history lesson in our bulletin! Return here to relive our growth from a small frame church to our present iconic building which is home to thousands of parishioners.

This Week: Our Stained Glass Windows, Part I

1892–2017



To sit in St. James church is to be surrounded by the Communion of Saints. There are the people sharing the pews of course – companions on the journey of faith, baptized into the Communion of Saints.

But look up at the windows. We are embraced from all sides by the saints who people the calendar and even some, like Christopher and Philomena, who lost their dates in recent decades. Our elder brothers and sisters in faith – Mary and Joseph, Patrick and Bridget, Francis and Clare – that “great cloud of witnesses” who cheer us on from their place in glory.

Continue to gaze at the windows and the Stations of the Cross and see the names of other faithful aunts and uncles and cousins who share our lives in the Communion of Saints. Parishioners in the early 1950s purchased the stained glass windows for \$250 each, sometimes, as early records show, paying installments of as little as \$1.00 or \$2.00 over weeks and months. Some windows and Stations record the name of the donor; others the name of the person the donor wished to memorialize. And therein lie the stories.

J. O. Martin, a highly regarded parishioner and citizen, donated the Saint Christopher window in memory of his sons: Paul died in France during World War II and Jacques was lost when his Navy ship was torpedoed in the Atlantic Ocean in 1943. Harry McGinnis chose St. John Chrysostom to remember his son Captain John McGinnis who perished in the Korean war. While he lived, Harry McGinnis sat in the pew by that window, in the company of the golden-tongued Church Father and his own beloved child. Lt. Col. Henry C. Drewes, USMC, was mortally wounded in the battle of Tarawa, and his family donated the Saint Matthias window in his memory. Father Mullarkey remembered his parents in the St. Bridget window. So many of the stories remain untold, but we know these holy men and women accompany us still.



“This is what I remember of the rose window above the sanctuary. No records have yet turned up to confirm the story. The window is dedicated to the memory of Sister Callista who taught first grade in the 1940s and who succumbed to cancer while still a young woman. She was devoted to the Infant of Prague and made by hand clothing for the statue of the Infant. The triangular shapes in red around the center of the window represent the Infant. Sister Callista called me “Jeannie-bud.” ~Jeanne Trott
