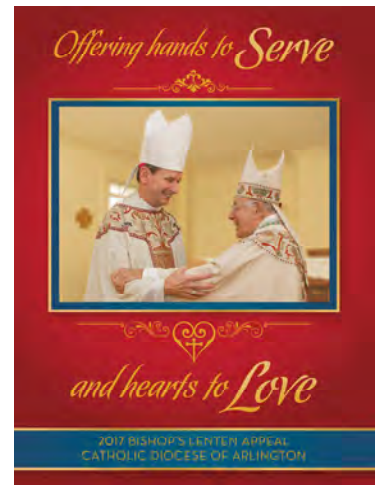

From our Pastor



Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" (For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water. John 4:5-10

I love this image of Jesus walking up to the woman at the well and engaging her in conversation. The reader can tell that she is put off not only by a Jew talking to her, but also at first, with his request for water to drink. The woman, into whose life we get just a momentary glimpse, is obviously fraught with hardship: hardship for one because of the many relationships in her life that have turned out poorly. John puts special emphasis on the time of day: noon. They arrive at the well at the hottest moment of the day, when the sun is at its greatest height. Jesus approaches her and begins a simple conversation by requesting something from her, a drink of water. Her acute awareness, and subsequent resentment of the bias that Jews have towards Samaritans is obvious with her response, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" Patiently Jesus converses with her and slowly she begins to understand that Jesus is not just asking for a cup of water, but is actually offering her the waters of new life, a new spiritual beginning, a cleansing of the old ways of her life, for rebirth into a holier and happier life. She would not only come to understand who Jesus truly is, but would also bring others to Him. They, like her, would draw spiritual waters from him. I love the way the reading concludes, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this truly is the savior of the world."

Last year Pope Francis, in his Jubilee Year of Mercy, called upon us all not only to know of the mercy that God has for each of us, but also for us to be instruments of mercy to others. In one of his homilies that year he said, "Jesus' attitude is striking: we do not hear the words of scorn, we do not hear words of condemnation, but only words of love, of mercy, which are an invitation to conversation. 'Neither do I condemn you; go, and do not sin again.'"

Just as Jesus approached the Samaritan woman, let us approach one another with patience and mercy. As we continue our Lenten journey, I encourage you to first thank God that He is loving and merciful to us each and every day. Also, if there is someone in your life that is like the woman at the well, begin a conversation in which you both can walk together with the Lord. ~Fr. Posey

FASTING

Fasting helps us refocus on God. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, all healthy Catholics ages 18-59 are required to fast and abstain from meat. Fasting means one main meal and no more than two small meals that together don't equal the main meal. Catholics 14 and older are to abstain from meat on Fridays throughout Lent.

ALMSGIVING

Giving sacrificially during Lent connects us to those who are poor and helps connect our relationship with Jesus to our relationships with others. 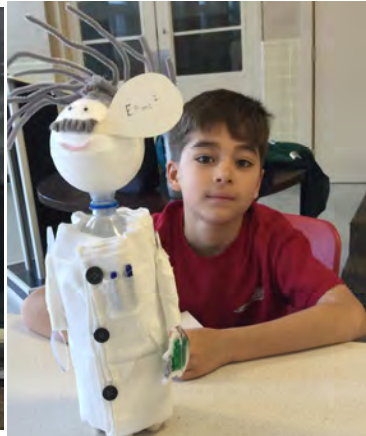

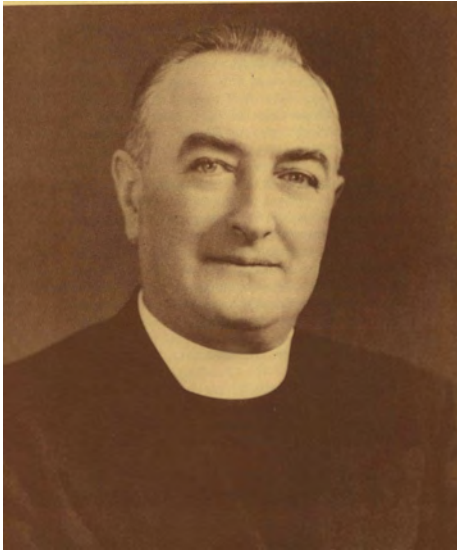

1892–2017

1931-1953 - FATHER EDWARD V. MULLARKEY, FOURTH PASTOR



Father Edward V. Mullarkey (1890-1953) came to Virginia in 1920, the year following his ordination in his native Ireland. In 1931, he came to St. James as our fourth pastor. At the time Saint James posted these demographic numbers:

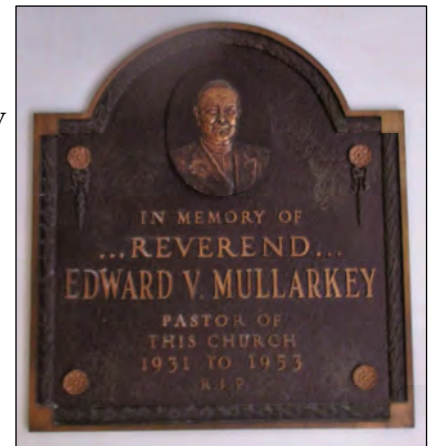
Parish membership: 85 families

School enrollment: 85 students

Deep in the Great Depression, families were struggling and Father Mullarkey made it his goal to become acquainted with every one of those families in the parish. He shepherded his parishioners and the IHM community through the financial concerns of this difficult time.

The war years then came. World War II brought a flood of government and military families to Northern Virginia. The decade of the 1940's was a time of increased growth. The school was too small and the church was crowded. Father Mullarkey oversaw land acquisition, the construction of a new academic facility and renovations enlarging the original stone church.

During his pastorate, Father Mullarkey led the parish in meeting the many challenges of a changing community and at the same time managed to care for the spiritual welfare of his increasing flock. When he died in 1953 he left not only legacy of brick and mortar, but a parish community numbering 1,698 families and a school enrollment of 1,744 children. Father Mullarkey is buried in St. James Cemetery. A bronze memorial plaque is located in the front vestibule of the church.

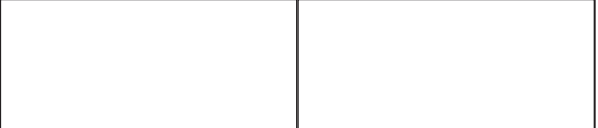
