

From Our Pastor



Our Gospel today recounts the familiar image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. We see Christ as not only the loving caretaker, but the very vehicle to salvation. He is at once guide and "gate." Through a truly personal relationship with Him we are led to our salvation. How do we attain and nurture this relationship? How do we nurture any relationship that is important to us?


By being present. By spending time with the other person. We choose our friends because we have things in common; we enjoy their company; we can rely upon them. A real and lasting relationship is built upon shared experiences. In today's world this is becoming increasingly more difficult.

It is no secret that I am rather fond of gadgets, especially those with an Apple embossed on them. And while they can make my life easier (I can check my 'steps' and heart-rate to ensure I'm exercising enough; I can even turn off the lights in my office if I forget and am away from the rectory), they can also pull me away from the here and now. I am no different than many of us: it's easy to get lost in a Facebook feed or the latest newspaper articles. Yet there is no substitute for personal presence, in actually speaking with a long-lost friend instead of "liking" a recent post. Prayer itself takes on a different focus when offered with others.

Our reflection for the week challenges us to try a for day, or even a few hours, to devote ourselves to some "electronics-free" time. Encourage family members to do the same. Spend that time focused on those people *right in front of you*. Take some of that time to get to know our Good Shepherd. Bring your cares to Him; allow yourself to get to know Him just as well as He knows you. Start the conversation.

Today is World Prayer Day for vocations. Please ask the Lord to open the ears and hearts of men and women to "hear his voice" in discernment. So too, please pray for all priests, sisters, brothers and deacons that they may continue to live out their calling with kindness, mercy and compassion.





The results are in! The most recent 40 Days for Life (<u>www.40daysforlife.com</u>) prayer campaign was conducted from September 28 to November 6. In answer to prayers from around the world, God's mercy was clearly evident:

341 locations, 30 countries100,000 participants, 4,700 churches637 lives saved from abortion13 abortion workers quit their jobs9 abortion facilities closed

We help through action...

On April 29, there were crowds in Washington, DC and across the nation in a day of prayer and protest against Planned Parenthood and their huge taxpayer subsidy. This event was coordinated by #ProtestPP, a coalition of more than 70 national, state and local pro-life organizations, calling for Planned Parenthood to be stripped of its federal funding, and for all such funding to be redirected to Federally Qualified Health Centers that do not perform abortions. Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion chain, receives over \$430 million from the federal government every year.

100 YEAR FATIMA ANNIVERSARY


Though the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima took place almost a hundred years ago, Our Lady's call to prayer and penance for the salvation of souls and peace in the world is as relevant now as when first delivered to three Portuguese peasant children in 1917.

The 13th Day dramatizes the true story of three young shepherds who experienced six apparitions of Our Lady between May and October 1917, which culminated in the final prophesied Miracle of the Sun on October 13. Abducted from their homes, thrown into prison, and interrogated under the threat of death in the government's attempt to silence them, the children remained true to their story about the crucial messages from Mary of prayer, repentance, and conversion for the world. *Parents are strongly urged to review this film before sharing with children*.

The photo is the Pageant of Lourdes with Nancy Lyons as the Virgin Mary and Rosemary Maguire as Bernadette.

The prayerful Bernadette in the tableau of Our Lady of Lourdes is Rosemary Maguire, now Sister Marie Vianney, IHM, living in Camilla Hall, Immaculata, Pennsylvania. (Camilla Hall benefits from the Nun Fun Run sponsored each year by St. James School.) Rosemary lived with her family in a big house just a block from St. James. An earlier resident of that same house was Robert Eugene Shreve, who helped excavate the foundation for the first stone St. James church. Two of Rosemary's brothers also entered religious life: Robert was a Jesuit priest and William was a Trappist brother.
