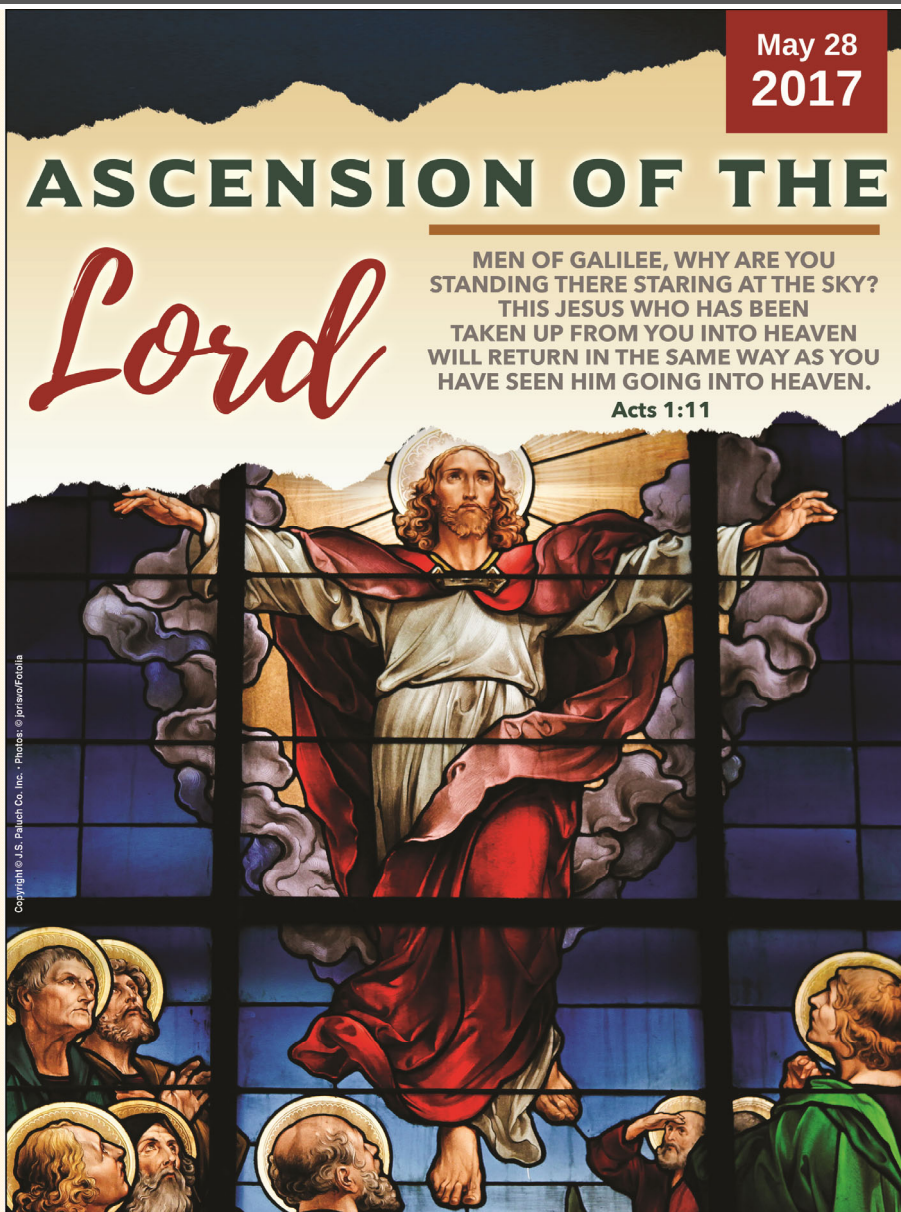

From Our Pastor



"A true missionary who never ceases to be a disciple, knows Jesus walks with him speaks to him, breathes with him, works with him" Pope Francis

Last week at our anniversary Mass, I noted we began as a mission church. However, we are more than the beautiful stonework or shining stained glass. Our Christianity resides not simply within a building; but it is part of who we are as a people. It propels us forward and outward; we literally become the mission.

My clerics and the habits of our religious Sisters reveal our vocations and the mission by which we live. People may be drawn to us by our outward appearance – to question, to learn or even to heal. You, the good people of Saint James, reveal your discipleship not necessarily in clothing, but by your actions. I love that “pay it forward” commercial where one good deed, seemingly done in anonymity but witnessed by one, inspires another to go out of their way. The pattern is repeated throughout the ad, reminding us that people are paying attention.

There is a well-known quote which says, “only a disciple can make a disciple.” If we do not actively witness our faith through kindness, compassion and mercy, our churches would eventually empty because the ruse would be revealed. But our faith endures precisely because we live it, even when it is hard to do. We reach out to others even if we ourselves are hurting or damaged. We go out when we’d rather stay in because we are called to do so. We bring others to Christ in ways great and small. This week, as our reflection question beckons, I ask you to look within yourself and see how to show your discipleship to others. It can be a kind word, or a gesture; it can be a phone call to a friend; it could be perhaps an hour of volunteer service. However you choose, I ask you to “pay it forward.”

This weekend we honor those who gave completely of themselves in service to our country. Their example is the supreme act of paying it forward. Their sacrifices for our country continue to inspire generations. To them and their families, we owe a debt of gratitude.

I would be remiss if I did not thank all those who made our anniversary Mass and reception such a fantastic event. 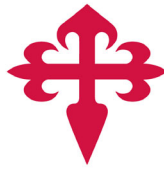

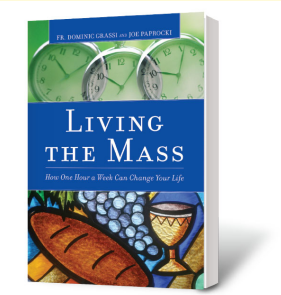
The Journey of Faith begins with your questions. What is faith? How does faith grow? What do Catholics believe and why is it different from other faith traditions?

1951-1952 - THE ENLARGING OF ST. JAMES CHURCH

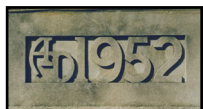


The Cornerstone as well as the exterior and interior of St. James Church was blessed by Bishop Ireton at dedication ceremonies. The Rev. John Rea, assistant pastor, is at the left, and Very Rev. Justin D. McClunn, Chancellor, is at the right. From 1977-1980, Msgr. McClunn served as 6th pastor of St. James.

By 1950, six Sunday Masses in the church were overcrowded and the Holy Ghost Fathers and Franciscan Friars of the Atonement were coming to help Father Mullarkey and his two assistant pastors; Masses were still being said in the mission parishes in El Nido and Herndon. The school auditorium was called into service and still the crowding was uncomfortable and unsafe. With agreement from Bishop Peter L. Ireton and full-hearted support from the parishioners, Father Mullarkey embarked on the enlargement of the church.

Work began on July 1, 1951, under Philadelphia architects Gleason and Mulrooney. Construction was led by parishioner A. P. DiGiulian's company. A cruciform church emerged, while the parish gathered for Mass in the school auditorium and cafeteria. A daughter of A. P. DiGiulian (known in the parish as Reds) remembers Father Mullarkey coming to their home for dinner and "the Irishman and the Italian" discussing progress on the church building. Her father, she recalls, had to work hard to persuade Father Mullarkey that the main altar should come from Italy, of Italian marble. The altar then became the gift of parishioner Marcus Bles, who eventually sold his cattle farm to those who would develop Tysons Corner.

Bishop Ireton came to bless the cornerstone and dedicate the new church on October 12, 1952, 50 years after the cornerstone was laid for the original stone church. Father Edward V. Mullarkey died on May 6, 1953, a few months after the joyous dedication of the enlarged church. He had presided over the destiny of St. James Parish for almost 22 years and during his tenure watched the number of families grow from 85 to 1,698. In October 2016, the number of families in the parish was 3,096.

The mosaic pelican on the altar front is an ancient Christian symbol, originating in myth and faith. In times of famine, the mother pelican was said to pierce her breast with her beak, feeding her chicks with her life blood. The story was appropriated by Christians and applied to the life-giving death of Jesus on the cross.
