

From Our Pastor



"He who is called to the ministry is not the 'master' of his vocation, but rather the administrator of a gift that God has entrusted to him for the good of all the people."

Pope Francis

Today's readings are both warning and witness. They caution against the great sin of pride that Pope Francis references. Malachi is forceful in his recriminations, just as Jesus is to the Pharisees. The priests of the Old Testament and the Pharisees of Jesus' day talk a great game, but do not walk the walk. Enamored with their own status, they forget the awesome responsibility they bear to those who follow them. For the faithful look up to their teachers; they hold them in great esteem because they are God's representatives on earth.

Paul puts it even plainer: "...in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God." Powerful and profound words, and fitting during National Vocations Week. As we seek and pray for an increase in the number of priestly, diaconal and religious callings, Scripture reminds us, and especially those in discernment, of the seriousness of this commitment.

Every day I pray for my brother priests, both living and deceased. I pray for the wonderful men and women religious who have been incredible examples in my own life: examples of faithful, selfless and dedicated witness. And I pray for myself, that I heed Christ's words and remain open to the gifts of the Holy Spirit, ever mindful that MY witness is a witness of my calling and a reflection of God's presence in my life.

I often tell engaged couples, "Do not think of your wedding day as the happiest day of your life." It may be up to that point, but they will have many "happiest days." So, too, I remember the sense of immense peace, and not a little trepidation, at my ordination. The excitement and energy I wanted to bring in sharing what I have learned: that Christ is my Savior and in His name I will proclaim His great love and mercy. I have had many "happiest days" since 1991; and not a few that have been difficult. But whether in joy or sorrow, I know that my God is with me.

My life has been enriched by my vocation. I know that I have received more than I have given; yet I hope what I have given has been good enough. I have gained strength from those who face their own daily challenges; I have gained compassion by witnessing the unconditional love of parents; I have gained wisdom from the talents of others; I have seen Christ in everyday living and in the most extreme circumstances.

Today I ask you to pray especially for the women and men who are now deliberating their calling. Pray that their hearts and minds are open to God's voice. Pray that they are supported and fostered along this road that we all travel together. God Bless.

Scouting for Food


