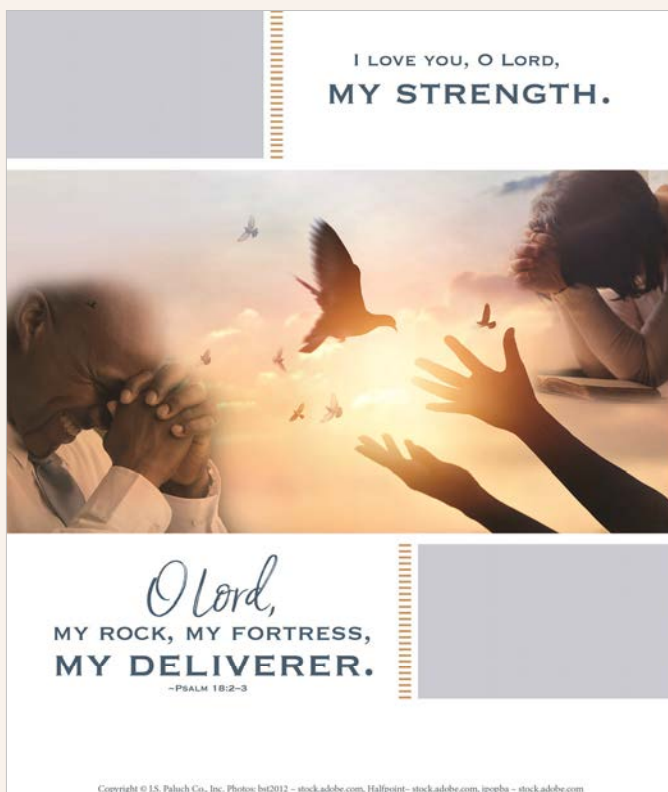

Ministry Highlight – Parish Library

As we continue our parish self-study, this week's article gives us a closer look at the parish library, which gives us an opportunity to better know and understand our faith. ~Fr. Posey

Are you searching for just the right books to enrich your life, a meaningful volunteer opportunity, or a place to chat with friends before or after Mass? Our new parish library offers all these options in the House of Ministries right next-door to the Rectory!

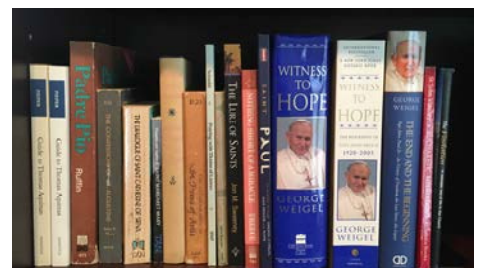
DonnaMaria Duatschek heads this new ministry inspired by the vast library of Lucie Dilger, a daily St. James communicant who died two years ago. An intellectually curious German teacher born in Berlin, Lucie had jam-packed eight bookcases offering wide-ranging works on Catholicism, scripture commentary, art history, music, and history. In considering how best to use these books, St. James parishioner Pauline Hunter suggested that a parish library could be established to house and share many of them. That seed concept blossomed when Father Posey approved the proposal and authorized use of the House of Ministries at 913 Park Avenue, under the supervision of a parochial vicar. Father Bashista opened and blessed this new ministry last May, and now Father Cozzi reviews and approves each book added to the collection, now numbering about 900.

The library is open on the first and third Sundays of each month from 10:00am to 2:00pm as long as two volunteers are available to be present. Such a deal: you could attend the 9:00am Mass, for example, and volunteer to stay and serve in the library where you could also check out or return volumes and chat with visitors! The library's hours of availability could expand in response to customer demand. And to supplement the library, a proposed e-library might offer opportunities for devoted readers to share their reviews of uplifting, nurturing books. When reviews become available on the St. James website, parishioners may browse them to better inform their book selections. Reviews are welcome on books within the collection, of course, in addition to other works of interest.

How precisely can this new library help us? For example, it includes books on lives of saints that 7th and 8th graders may find helpful in their preparation for Confirmation. It offers children's books that parents can feel comfortable with given their prior scrutiny by a parochial vicar. Those interested in bible study will find a wide range of scripture commentaries. In our increasingly secular world, the library offers works appropriate for those seeking wide-ranging reading choices compatible with Catholic principles. Good reading choices can help us all by inspiring resilience and a focus on our core values including, of course, compassion for others.

How can you both support and benefit from this project? It's so easy: just visit the library at 913 Park Avenue between 10:00am and 2:00pm on the first or third Sundays of the month. Once you check it out, you will be motivated to sample some of its works and perhaps to volunteer as well. Good reading offers a path to draw closer to God and to focus on what's most important in our lives. Stop by next week!

ST. JAMES CEMETERY (Part II)

St. James Cemetery is rich in symbols engraved and carved on the stones of many departed. There are symbols of life like ivy leaves and oak leaves, religious symbols like rosaries, doves and crosses, and symbols that reflect the great goodness of life on earth including a circus wagon, a horse, a plow, books and poems.

A large crucifix once stood on a raised concrete platform in the center of the old section. Parishioners would gather there for Mass early in the morning on Memorial Day (known before the Second World War as Decoration Day). Plagued by summer gnats and feet wet with dew in the long grass, they would stay to visit the graves of loved ones and leave flowers as a remembrance. Weather eroded the crucifix. It was taken down and the platform removed.

A new section was added in the late 1970s when the old house adjacent to the cemetery (that had served as the first rectory) was demolished, making room for more who have gone before us. Our pastor at the time of our 100th Anniversary, Monsignor William Reinecke, had the plaque at the cemetery gate installed, a gift of the Kolasch family.

Sometime before the Civil War, an African American – unknown, illiterate, enslaved – created a spiritual called “In That Great Gettin’ Up Mornin’.” In the song, the Lord calls on Gabriel to blow his trumpet. “How loud can I blow it?” Gabriel asks, and the Lord replies

In that great getting’ up mornin’, Fare ye well, fare ye well.

In that great getting’ up mornin’, Fare ye well, fare ye well.

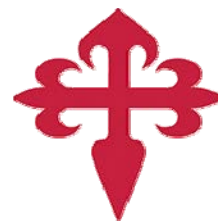
Blow one blast calm and easy, Fare ye well, fare ye well.

To wake my people that are sleeping, Fare ye well, fare ye well.

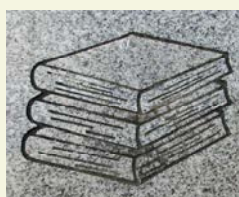
