The Ten Commandments: Introduction

The Ten Commandments are and always have been at the center of the Church's moral teachings. This doesn't mean that Catholic morality is merely an issue of commandments and obedience, but that the Ten Commandments best summarize how to live in covenant with God. So, beginning today and running through Easter Sunday, this column will provide reflections on the Commandments. In this way we can better know the moral excellence to which the life of Christ calls us.

First we need to understand the context of the Commandments. summarized so well in the introductory verse: "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Ex 20:2). This touches on the relationship between the Commandments and freedom. The Lord freed the Israelites from slavery. His Commandments do not undo that freedom but bring it to completion. It's difficult for the modern mind to grasp that a commandment can free. But the purpose of the Commandments is precisely this, to foster a spiritual freedom in those whom the Lord had already physically freed.

Second, the Commandments are an aspect of the Covenant the Lord establishes with Israel. Indeed, they are the heart of that Covenant. The introductory verse in effect proclaims the parties to the covenant: the Lord God who freed them and the Israelites who were freed. The Commandments themselves express how that union with one another is to be lived.

This is why the Commandments (except the 3^{rd} and 4^{th}) are technically not commands at all. "Shall" is the indicative, not imperative. It has the force of command in much the same way a "Wet Paint" sign does. It doesn't command so much as express the truth and thus indicate how we ought to live in covenant with the Lord.

Third, the Lord freed the Israelites from Egypt for a purpose: worship. This is realized ultimately when they enter the Promised Land and build the Temple. But this purpose of the Exodus highlights the connection between morality and worship. We glorify God when we live in his truth and keep his commandments.

The Commandments also have a distinct unity. Sometimes they are simply called the "Decalogue," a Greek word meaning "the ten sayings." This one-word summary conveys the point that the commandments form an organic whole. They are as intrinsically bound to one another as the members of a body. Indeed, the ancient saying is that if you violate one commandment you violate them all. There's no picking and choosing which commandment to obey. Only all of the Commandments together express the life of the covenant.

Finally, there is a structure to the Commandments. God wasn't just rattling them off the top of his head. He gave them in an order for a reason. The Commandments follow a linear, logical progression from the highest principle (the One God), through all the implications of that truth, all the way down to even interior observance (you shall not covet).

Let me propose another image for the structure of the Decalogue. Think of the Commandments as concentric circles radiating out from a central point. That central point is the Covenant, our union with God. Each Commandment is simply a radiation from that truth. The closer to that central truth, the more important the Commandment. Or, viewing it from another direction, we can understand each Commandment as circle of defense guarding that central point. They all together defend that union with God that is eternal life.





Please join us in prayers of gratitude for Jean's good work and for her peaceful transition to life in Pennsylvania.




A St. James Special Exposition


