Stewardship: Second Collection for Porto Charities October 14

Next week we will participate in the diocesan collection for the annual "Special Kids/Special Needs" campaign of Porto Charities, which supports programs for intellectually and developmentally challenged individuals. Last year, through your support, over \$106,000 was collected from our parishes to be distributed to numerous special education and disability related programs throughout the diocese, including those at Paul VI, Bishop O'Connell and Saint John Paul the Great, Holy Spirit and St. Mark's schools.

It is my objective to further develop this ministry within our diocese, including increasing the number of schools that offer special education programs.

From Our Pastor



"It is not good for the man to be alone." Genesis 2:18

The quote from Genesis is a popular one, found in many wedding services. It reminds us that we live, not for ourselves alone, but for others. It also reminds us that "God so loved the world he offered His only Son" as the ultimate example of profound and selfless love. This is a love which is outward looking, all-encompassing and bound not by time or distance.

There is a beautiful video produced by the Blackfriars in New York (watch it here: <https://bit.ly/2ReQGrV>) of George Herbert's poem-turned-hymn which, to me, epitomizes God's presence in our lives. "*Come My Way, My Truth, My Life*" sees a solitary friar singing this haunting piece amidst the hustle of New York City, his tenor voice above the din of traffic, boats and trains. The friar is literally placed right in the thick of things... on bridges, in train stations and parks. He represents God seeking to find us where we are, His love above all things bridging that gap between us and those around us.

In a society which measures so much by the number of "friends" on a Facebook page or retweets, God challenges us to love more personally, one by one. While social media has many positive attributes (I personally enjoy seeing news from my nieces and nephews), it can't replace the powerful effect of tangible human contact. We are called to be light for each other, even in the darkest and most difficult circumstances. Dorothy Day once spoke of love as the "only solution" for loneliness. It is in that spirit that I challenge each of us to reach out. Reach out to those on the periphery. Reach out to those who you know are going through their own trials. Don't be afraid to make that call or visit.

Let us join the song which bids us to live "such a joy as none can move; such a love as none can part; such a heart that joys in love."

We were blessed this year with generous funding through our Offertory which saw a 10% increase. This provided opportunities for new activities and campus improvements, which we could not have done without your increased support. Our School received close to \$250,000 via PTO and Parish fundraising efforts. We have joined hands in prayer; we have fed the hungry; given comfort to the sorrowing and rejoiced in fellowship. We have comforted the sick through Anointing (**80**) and prayed for those departed (**66** funerals, **300** souls at our Mass of Remembrance). 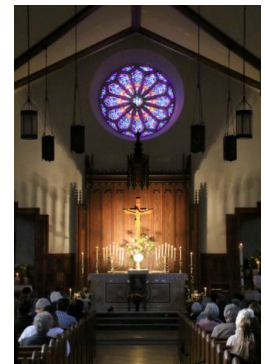
