

On The Way

The Immaculate Conception and Christmas, II

As with any feast, we celebrate the Immaculate Conception first and foremost to praise God for what He has accomplished. He deserves to be praised for His handiwork, and in this case for preserving Mary free from sin. Second, we celebrate the feast to venerate and honor Mary for what God has accomplished in her. Every saint is a masterpiece of God. Our Lady surpasses each of them and all of them — and deserves to be venerated in that way.

Further, in this celebration, as with every feast, we also learn something about ourselves. Again, what God accomplished in Mary by an extraordinary and singular grace He desires to accomplish in us by the ordinary working of grace. When we consider the Immaculate Conception, this means two things: freedom and fullness.

First, He wants to free us from all sin and all the effects of sin. He preserved Mary from sin and its effects ahead of time, in view of Christ's merits on the Cross. Sin never touched her in the least. In our case, however, we are born with sin. It clings to us from the very start of our lives. God frees us from sin in Baptism. Then, through the course of our life, He renews and/or deepens our freedom from sin by way of the Sacrament of Confession and our own acts of penance. Central to the Christian life is this progressive freedom from sin. We strive to cooperate with God's work in our souls so that we too can be free from every stain of sin.

Second, He wants us to fill us with His grace. Indeed, His preserving Mary from all sin was so that she could be filled perfectly with His grace. In her great book The Reed of God, Caryll Houselander likens the Virgin Mary to an empty chalice meant to be filled with the wine of offering or a hollow reed capable of receiving the breath of God. We can understand her Immaculate Conception — that freedom from sin — as an emptiness meant to be filled.

Years after Mary's conception the Archangel Gabriel greets her as full of grace. That emptiness that freedom from sin — had been filled with grace. Having never been touched by sin, she responded perfectly to all God's initiatives and thus increased to a fullness of grace that no one else can approach.

We too are to become gradually full of grace. Not, of course, to the same degree or in the same manner as our Lady. Hers is a singular grace. Nevertheless, our lives are to become more and more defined by God's grace by His work within us. Baptism places the seed of grace within us so that it can increase and grow continuously throughout our lives.

Mary's immaculate conception reveals our lofty calling — and also how often we settle for less. God desires to accomplish these two great works in us: to free us from the great evil of sin and to fill us abundantly with His grace.

Thinking about, and then choosing just one yes, draws you deeper into the heart of Christ who rejoices in our company.

Each action, each "yes" to God, no matter how small, is a profound sign of devotion and humble acknowledgment of how much we need Our Lord to be in our lives. Once you say "yes" to God once, you will want to say "yes" many times over. Let us join together and commit to prayer, service and self-sacrifice during the Advent and Christmas seasons this year.

Make this Advent and Christmas different than previous years. Commit to Just One Yes. It will change you, your family, your community, and, like Mary's powerful "yes" to God, it can change the world.

May Our Lord continue to bless you and your family, now and always.


