Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to people of good will (Lk 2:14).

Dear Friends in Christ,

The promise of peace is one of the most welcome messages of Christmas. God's own angels proclaim this peace to the shepherds as part of "the good news of great joy...for all the people" (Lk 2:10).

The announcement of that peace answers one of the deepest longings of the human heart. We see conflict and disharmony all around us — in the world, in our country, and unfortunately even in our homes. We experience the lack of peace within ourselves and thus the corresponding desire for the One Who will restore us to peace. On this feast we rejoice that such peace has arrived. He is born, the Prince of Peace.

We see this peace already present at our Lord's crib. In Bethlehem all creation is in effect reconciled: animals, humans, angels all unite in worship of the One God. We find gathered around Him both the impoverished shepherds and the wealthy wise men, both Jews and Gentiles. All people and all nations find unity in Him. In the beautiful scene of the Holy Family, we find peace for all families.

Most importantly, He does not bring a superficial or passing peace. It is not just an absence of conflict or an ease of life. It is the interior peace that comes from being reconciled with God, from God's dwelling among and within us. Not as the world gives does He give this peace (cf. Jn 14:27).

At the same time, His peace requires something from us. It is meant for people of good will. We have to open our hearts sincerely to receive Him. Let us humbly approach Him in His rest in Bethlehem and express our sincere desire for "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding" (Php 4:7).

Please know of the prayers of the priests at Saint James for you and your loved ones. May the Prince of Peace, born this day of the Virgin Mary, establish His peace in your hearts and home. Through the intercession of our Lady and Saint James, may the Lord bless you always.
