



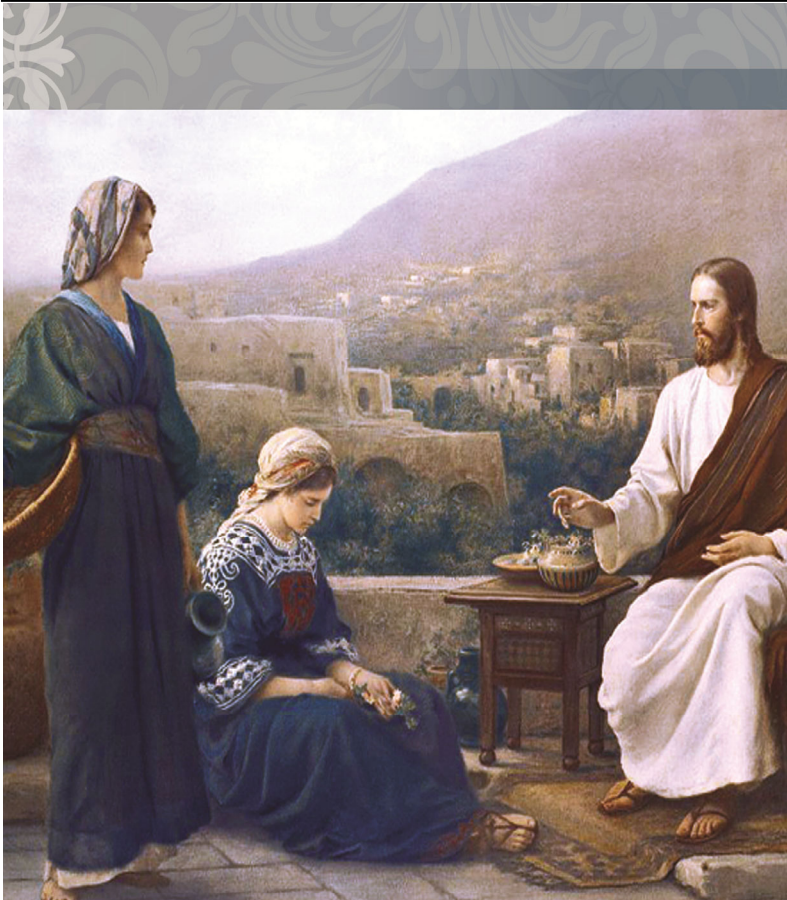

On The Way

This Thursday, July 25, is the Feast of Saint James. Since he is our patron our parish observes this feast as a solemnity — meaning a bigger celebration and more feasting.

Every saint teaches us something about how to follow Christ. Each one reveals a different dimension of discipleship. So it is fair to ask what Saint James has to teach us. Perhaps we can narrow it down to three things.

First, promptness to the Lord's call. The Gospels tell us that when our Lord called James and his younger brother John, "Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him" (Mt 4:21-22). Note that: Immediately. James had certainly encountered and heard Jesus before. But when our Lord called him, he responded immediately. Our Lord beckons to us many times throughout the day. How often we delay our response and keep him waiting. May Saint James gain for us the grace to respond promptly — immediately — to those calls.

Second, magnanimity or greatness of soul. At one point James and John approached Jesus and asked, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left" (Mk 10:37). It is a bold request, and one that angered the other Apostles. But it also reveals a holy kind of ambition, a greatness of soul in matters of faith. It is the virtue that seeks to give and to receive great things. For us, who so often give little to the Lord and expect little from Him, may Saint James gain the grace of magnanimity.

Third, perseverance. Our Lord asked James and John, "Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They responded, "We can" (Mark 10:38-39). It was that kind of youthful, zealous response that does not consider the cost. As with marriage vows and ordination promises, the speaker only faintly knows what's on the other side of the pledge. But Saint James persevered in this response. He was in fact the first Apostle to be martyred (cf. Acts 12:2) — the first to drink the cup that He drank and to be baptized with His baptism of blood. For us, who so often fail to continue in our resolutions and promises to the Lord, may Saint James gain the grace of perseverance.

Please come to the 730pm Mass on Thursday to celebrate Saint James — with an ice cream social to follow. Make time to honor and **celebrate our patron, that we may benefit from both his example and intercession.** ~Fr. Scalia

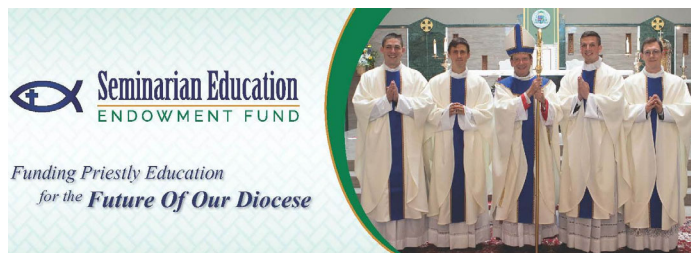
Stewardship
