From Our Pastor



"You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test." Luke 4:12

In today's gospel, Christ confronts three great temptations: physical, psychological and spiritual challenges to Jesus' divinity and the Father's authority. The first is a seemingly innocuous enticement of our most base needs, food. After some time in the desert, Jesus was hungry. Probably VERY hungry. We have all walked into our kitchens, offices, and classrooms and have known the temptation that bread, cookies, donuts can exert. However, Jesus reminds us that there is more to us as human beings than satisfying physical hunger: "man does not live by bread alone."

So the devil goes one step further and assaults His pride with the promise of power. He appeals to Jesus' ego. But, what the devil misses is that Christ has no ego; His ministry a tangible example of a literal emptying of self for our benefit; which leads us to the third, and most damaging, temptation: control.

When the devil tempts Jesus to throw himself over the cliff he taunts Him: "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written: He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you, and: With their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." (Luke 4:10-11) Baiting Him to reveal ego and pride, He refuses to usurp God. He is God's obedient Son.

Evil doesn't necessarily enter into our lives with a thunderclap; it is more subtle, like an appeal to hunger. Or to control, which is just another way to describe pride. I can decide my fate. I alone am the determining factor. I don't need anyone or anything; I'm not hurting anyone. It is this insipid notion that gives rise to sin. If we see only ourselves and our wants, we fail to realize the interconnectedness of our lives. Remember St. Paul's analogy: we are all parts of one body, none is greater than the whole. And the whole is God.

We must be vigilant, and Lent is a perfect time to return to the Lord; to find grace in the Sacraments to face our temptations. "Giving something up" for Lent is not meant to be punitive or a quick diet fix. It is meant as a spiritual exercise to strengthen our resolve, reorient our focus on others and ultimately lead us further along our path to salvation.

I pray this Lent does just that. We are here for you at Saint James along the walk to Calgary and beyond. Our Light is on every Wednesday for Confession. The Stations of the Cross and our Holy Hours allow for quiet reflection on Christ's great sacrifice.

Don't forget! Lenten Fish Fries began on March 8th. Tim Aubry and his Fish Fry Working Group are once again planning for wonderful evenings of friendship. Why Can't I Eat Meat on Fridays During Lent?

Abstinence from meat on Fridays during Lent is a form of penance and a memorial of Christ's death that has been observed since the 1st Century, AD. It is a tangible reminder that Christ sacrificed his body for us on Good Friday. In honor of His sacrifice, we abstain from consuming flesh meat. The Church used to require abstinence on all Fridays during the year, but the Church relaxed that rule over time, starting in 1966, and in 1983 made only Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent days of abstinence. St. James Social Outreach – Focus on Hunger-Lenten Food Collection

During Lent, food collected at the doors of the Church will be given to the Falls Church Community Service Council (FCS) food pantry at Knox Presbyterian Church, Food for Others (a food bank that distributes food to many in the northern Virginia area), and distributed through the St. James Food Distribution Program. Please consider donating one pound bags of rice or kidney beans, boxes of cereal, tuna, peanut butter, jelly, and hearty soups. You can place your donations in the boxes near the doors of the Church after any mass. Donations of rice, beans, and cereal will remain at St. James and we will distribute them through our monthly food distribution program.

This weekend, we will give food donated by St. James’ parishioners to the FCS. St. James is a founding member of the Council. FCS’ food pantry provides non-perishable and fresh food to families in need. Volunteer staff at the pantry deliver food to families six days a week – Monday through Saturday. Congregations, individuals, and local food drives all donate to the pantry. The pantry staff purchases additional critical food supplies when needed as funds are available. Volunteers bag and deliver a week’s supply of food to needy clients.
